Remember to keep hunting for all your fabulous items you will bring to the auction in April.



AQG RECIPE CORNER

A BLAST FROM A PAST MEMBER!!

Impossible Chicken Pie

1 package (10oz) frozen broccoli
3 cups shredded cheese
1 1/2 cups cooked chicken
2/3 cup chopped onions
1 1/3 cups milk
3 eggs
3/4 cup Bisquick
3/4 tsp. salt (if desired)
1/4 tsp. pepper



Preheat oven to 400 degrees. 10 1/2 x 1 1/2 pie plate greased Rinse broccoli

Mix broccoli, 2 cups cheese, chicken and onions in pie plate. Beat eggs, milk, salt, pepper and Bisquick till smooth and pour over ingredients in pie plate. Bake 25 to 35 minutes or until knife comes out clean. Remove from oven and top with remaining shredded cheese. Return to oven for a minute or two till cheese melts.


TIP OF DAY!

Pressing & Pinning.

- 1. To make neat corners and points, seams must meet precisely. Pressing and pinning can help achieve matched seams.
- 2. To press, set your iron on cotton. Use an up-and-down motion, lifting the iron from spot to spot. Sliding the iron back and forth can push seams out of shape. First press the seam flat on the wrong side; then open the piece and press the right side
- 3. Press patchwork seam allowance to one side, not open as in dressmaking. If possible, press toward the darker fabric to avoid seam allowance showing through light fabric. Press seam allowances in opposite directions from row to row. By offsetting seam allowances at each intersection, you reduce the bulk under the patchwork. This is more important than pressing seam allowances toward dark fabric.
- **4.** Use pins to match seams. With right sides facing, align opposing seams, nesting seam allowances as shown in diagram at right. On the top piece, push a pin through the seam line 1/4" from the raw edges.

Then push the pin through the bottom seam and set it. Pins should NOT be directly in the seam to hold it. We pin about 1/8" away from where the seams meet as shown in the diagram. Pin all matching seams; then stitch the joining seams, removing pins as you sew.

5. When triangles are pieced with other units, seams should cross in an "X" on the back. If the joining seam goes precisely through the center of the X, the triangle will have a nice, sharp point on the front when pressed.



WHY YOU SHOULDN'T USE CANNED AIR ON YOUR MACHINE!



Reason: Because the lint and debris is pushed back into the back of your machine!
