# **AOG 2011 President's Annual Report**

The Officers for 2011 were President- Andrea Duckworth, Vice President- Huguette Boyer, Secretary- Linda Basler, and Treasurer- Debbie Santinelli.

The guild had 105 paid members and one honorary member for the year, for a total of 106 members.

Because our membership had increased, our general meetings were becoming very cramped. One of our members found NorthStar church that welcomed our guild to use their facilities at no charge. We made the change and our members voted unanimously to hold our general meetings there.

Our programs for the year consisted of one Challenge, 4 outside speakers, a Silent Auction, 4 showcases of members work, Quilto, and our annual Christmas Block Lottery and Christmas Exchange.

The Red Top Retreat had 53 in attendance.

We sent 18 quilts to Joplin, Missouri after a tornado leveled their city.

Sixteen members designed and made a quilt that was on display at the state capital. It was then donated to the Southeastern Quilt and Textile Museum to be auctioned off. We had six members volunteer to be at the capital while it was on display.

We combined the Fabric Exchange and Special Projects this year. It allowed us to have 4 quilts at the end of the year. On the "off" months, we put together the Red Top Goody bags, we learned how to make folded Christmas ornaments and braided tote handles, we had a paper piecing review, and we took a trip on the Southern Quilt Trail.

BOM was a Red Work project. It was well received by the members.

This was the 1<sup>st</sup> year we had a working budget as stated in the bylaws. We ended the year with \$1080.42 under budget. We also implemented an expense reimbursement form to be used when members turned in receipts.

We amended six By Laws to reflect greater clarity and accuracy.

Community Service produced 182 neck coolers for the troops, 250 pillowcases for the Con-Kerr cancer project, and 79 quilts for the Acworth police. We had an average attendance of 24 at the 4 Community Service events.

We implemented an Inclement Weather call list since our guild meets all year round. Currently we follow the Cobb County School closure policy. Since we had two ice storms during December and January we decided it would be wise to have a call list in place when schools were closed for vacation. We never had to use it.
