- ByLaw change: Change beginning of fiscal year from Jan to October to align with the GA Quilt Council's fiscal year - Voted and passed - new year will be Oct 1 - Sept 30 Dues will be \$18
- Guild grows to over 50 members with about 20 members attending open Executive Board meetings
- Vote by membership to have the AQG Quilt Show become once every other year, alternating with the East Cobb Quilt Guild Show schedule. We will have a show in 1994 to start the rotation schedule
- Committee Chair Positions now include: By-Laws, Newsletter, Sunshine, Publicity, Librarian, Membership, Phone, Hostess, Quilt Show
- Annie Ruth and James Davis donate an oak Pie Safe, handmade by James, to be used as a permanent Library at the Mars Hill Church
- Presentation of a handmade album block quilt top as a thank you to outgoing President Annie Ruth Davis - design taken from the guild's Pattern and Cookbook
