Over the years these ladies have published a book, been recognized by the Governor of Georgia and were instrumental in the formation of the North Georgia Quilt Council which evolved into the Georgia Quilt Council. There are over 500 members in this Council. Hats off to these ladies and everyone else involved in quilting for keeping this timeless craft part of our culture.
