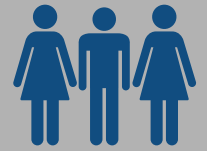

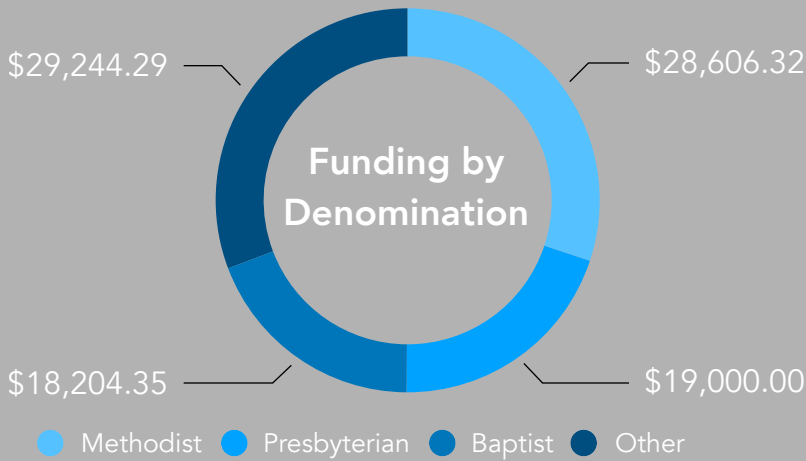

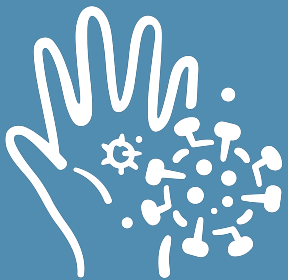

COVID - 19 RELIEF EFFORTS

6 pallets of food and supplies were distributed daily to communities across Robeson.

79 households aided by COVID emergency rent assistance between October 2020 and July 2021.

40,000 households reached since the pandemic began.



NEW & UPCOMING



1. Local Produce Boxes

In partnership with local farmers through the Robeson County Farmers Market and Produce Market these boxes will supply 200 families with fresh locally grown produce boxes each month.



2. Financial Literacy Class

In partnership with PNC Bank we will begin offering Financial Literacy classes. Classes will focus on monthly budgets, deposit accounts, and lending practices.



3. Mobile Assistance Unit

Our Mobile Assistance Unit will visit a different area of Robeson County each week and serve an additional 200 households per month providing food along with many of our other services to hard-to-reach areas.



4. Home Store Mural

Two high school students were chosen to paint murals onto the side of our Home Store. These murals will bring a positive and refreshing new look to the 5th street area.
