the resolution making business if I can help it. However, in this season of resolutions I have found myself examining some of the most famous resolutions to ever be authored. Jonathan Edwards is considered to be the most preeminent theologian America has ever produced. More than that he is considered by many to be the foremost thinker in American history. He wrote and delivered perhaps the most famous sermon in history outside of the sermons recorded in the Bible. Finally, he and George Whitefield were the fountainheads of the mighty river that was the Great Awakening. One of the most famous works of Edwards is his 70 Resolutions. They were part of this spiritual titan's strategy for living a holy life, pleasing to God. In this space I want to mention just two of the 70 but the whole body of these resolutions are very convicting and The two resolutions that I want to set before you are Resolution 22 and Resolution 62 which read:

22. Resolved, to endeavor to obtain for myself as much happiness, in the other world, as I possibly can, with all the power; might, vigor, and vehemence, yea violence, I am capable of, or can bring myself to exert, in any way that can be thought of.

62. Resolved, never to do anything but duty; and then according to Eph. 6:6-8, do it willingly and cheerfully as unto the Lord, and not to man; "knowing that whatever good thing any man doth, the same shall he receive of the Lord."

On the surface, at least in our modernday cultural understanding of the language, these seem like competing resolutions. One advocates for pursuing happiness at all costs. He says he should pursue happiness violently. Not to do violence to others but to pursue happiness with unabashed effort. Continued on next page

Most people in our culture today would applaud this statement with a surface level understanding of what Edwards was saying. Our age is one where most believe that they should sacrifice all on the altar of happiness. Yet, we need to read more carefully. Edwards says we should obtain happiness "in the other world". He speaks here of Heaven. This is similar to what Jesus was teaching when he said in Matthew 6:19-20 "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal." Edwards knew that happiness was not our chief pursuit in this world but it would be ours in fullness in the next if we know Christ.

If happiness is not our aim in this world what is our aim? The Bible would claim that our aim as Christians should be obedience. That is where resolution 62 comes in. We are to do our duty to God. Nothing else is important. Duty toward God or obedience is a far-reaching concept that touches every nook and cranny of our lives. It will inform the way we work, our relationships, our parenting, our finances, and everything else in between. Obedience is the calling.

He is the creator of time itself and will cause its end. And as the sovereign source and end of time, He is fully in control of all that happens between beginning and end. There is no chapter, no moment no matter how hard and dark, that He is not sovereign ruler over. He has not lost control, so look to Him and hold fast to who He is.

2. Make the best use of the time. The way the world looks at making the most out of time is to selfishly and shortsightedly make decisions. The way that Scripture tells us to do it is to, "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is." (Eph. 5:15-17)

There is no doubt that these days are evil. That becomes truer with each passing day, it seems. So then, we are to be careful with how we spend our time. And what better time to look at ourselves in this aspect than the beginning of a new year. What is it that we are giving time to that is unwise and foolish in the light of God's Word and eternity?
