[1/3]: What does the Bible say about AI?

Engage with AI in a way that honours biblical principles given by in the Bible.

- The Bible *does not directly address* artificial intelligence (AI).
- AI is a **modern technology** which has been developed long after biblical times.
- Apply principles regarding **knowledge**, **wisdom** and **stewardship** to **glorify God**.

1. Using knowledge responsibly and pursuing wisdom

⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding.

⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.
(Proverbs 3:5-6)

2. Exercising good stewardship over creation

²⁸ And God blessed them. And God said to them, “Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth.”
(Genesis 1:28)

3. Doing all things for God's glory

³¹ So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.
²¹ but test everything; hold fast what is good.

(1 Corinthians 10:31 and 1 Thessalonians 5:21)

³¹ And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good.
(Genesis 1:31)

[2/3]: Can scientists use AI to understand God better?



Understanding God using AI

- Understanding God is a **theological** journey.
- Even **advanced AI** has limits in comprehending God.
- AI can be used to **organise and analyse** God's word but it does not provide faith.

“²⁵ For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.
(1 Corinthians 1:25)

Could AI replace Christian religion?

- New tool to **engage** with the **Gospel**.
- Supplement some **administrative or scholarly** religious functions.
- AI can aid but **cannot replace** the Christian **religion and faith**.

²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.
(Hebrews 10:24-25)

[3/3]: Is AI a threat to God and human creation?

Does the creation of AI threaten God?

- God is **sovereign** and AI as a tool does not threaten His existence or authority.
- God **transcends human's** innovation and revolutions.
- God retains **ultimate power**, and control to restrain or employ AI.

¹⁹ The LORD has established his throne in the heavens,
and his kingdom rules over all.
(Psalm 103:19)

Is AI a problem for humans in the future?

- Presents **challenges** but **opportunities** hence biblical guidance on *regulation*.
- *Regulation* can assist in **human flourishing** but *diminish* it if *not regulated*.
- **Biblical guidelines** for AI can *promote flourishing* and *mitigate diminishment*.

¹⁰ The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom,
and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.
(Proverbs 9:10)

Should Christians fear Artificial Intelligence?

Why should Christians care about artificial intelligence?

- Society and **lifestyles** influenced by AI therefore the **Gospel** is needed.
- Engagement of **AI** needs to **align** with **biblical principles** and **teachings**.
- Immense **opportunity** to share the **Gospel** on a **huge scale**.

Should Christian scientists fear artificial intelligence?

- Approach AI with **caution** but not fear – align AI with **biblical principles**.
- AI has the **potential** to bear so much more **good fruit** compared to bad.
- Align **biblical knowledge** in the development and end use of AI tools is key.

Conclusions



Should Christians Scientists Fear Artificial Intelligence? Short answer: No.

1. What does the Bible say about AI? Not much.

- Biblical knowledge and wisdom should be applied to the use of AI.
- Biblical stewardship should be applied to creation to glorify God.

2. Can scientists use AI to understand God? Technically, yes.

- AI can be used to better understand God.
- AI cannot replace the Christian religion.

3. Is AI a threat to God and human creation? Not really.

- AI does not threaten God or His creation.
- AI is likely to progress human flourishing.
