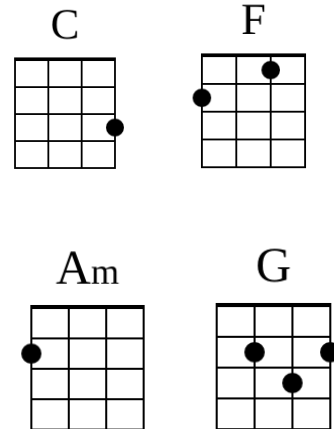
Verse 1:
