Known data suggests that William Thomas was born approximately 1865 near Bossier Parish, Louisiana. He married Alice Smith on 4 May 1889 in Bossier Parish, Louisiana. To this union, William and Alice Thomas produced approximately nine children. Louisiana State Death Records indicate William Thomas died on 8 November 1945. The client desired that research on several individuals within her maternal branch be identified for further clarity.

- 2. Sift through Freedmen's Bureau Records to locate post-emancipation labor records
- 3. Locate 1870 US Census for William Thomas and Rosa Anne Davis Nichols
- 4. Identify plantation upon which the Thomas family worked
- 5. Locate property records for William Thomas, Rosa Anne Davis Nichols
- 6. Research probate records within Bossier, Caddo, and Red River Parish, Louisiana for Wills and Successions of all direct maternal ancestors.
- 7. Use genetic evidence to identify relatives connected to maternal great-great grandfather, William "Willis" Thomas of Georgia.
