Dear Parents and Cadets,

- 1. Welcome to the Charles W. Flanagan High School (FHS) Navy Junior Reserve Officer's Training Corps (NJROTC) program. We are looking forward to a great year. Individual cadet grades are contingent upon performance in the following areas: academics, military proficiency skills, leadership, and summative assessments as outlined in the course syllabus. Cadets will participate in many extracurricular activities: Drill, Color Guard, Robotics, Raider Challenges, and other activities designed to enhance Leadership skills. Additional events include community service, fundraisers, and orientation trips. The NJROTC educational experience has a greater impact on cadets when they actively participate in unit activities. In order for the year to get off to a good start, we need your help with the following items:
- 2. Please read and sign the NJROTC Contract (2023-2024), Navy Junior Reserve Officer's Training Corps Program Syllabus, the Parent/Guardian Permission Form (2023-2024), the Release And Hold Harmless Agreement, the Assumption of Risk, Waiver, Release & Hold Harmless form, the Broward County Consent for Treatment, the Flanagan High School Code of Conduct Agreement, the BCPS Physical Form and return no later than ______. All these documents will be kept in the cadet's NJROTC file for the entire year.
- 3. We expect all cadets to meet unit-grooming standards (haircuts, buns, shaves, nails, etc.).
- 4. For classroom instruction, cadets will need pencil/pen, highlighter, and a two-inch three ring binder with a small amount of loose-leaf paper. For Physical Training (PT) cadets will need a pair of running shoes, white or black socks, and a water bottle for hydration.
- 5. All of the requirements outlined above are expected to be met by the required due dates that purposely occur prior to the course drop date. Failure to comply may result in your student being dropped from the program.
- 6. All NJROTC cadets must pay a maintenance fee that will cover the cost of various essential items not provided by the NAVY. The maintenance fee is \$50.00. All items listed in the maintenance fee is yours to keep. This includes: one physical training shirt, one physical training short, all alterations to the uniform, and cleaning of the uniform before issued, green Falcon Battalion shirt, uniform name tag, shoe polish kit, and coverage under the NJROTC Flanagan Group Insurance Policy. Course Overview: The Navy Junior Reserve Officer's Training Corps (NJROTC) program is a Naval Sciences (NS) Leadership Education program designed to teach leadership skills, character development, self-discipline, and citizenship through the study and practical application of naval leadership traits and principles. The NJROTC program combines classroom instruction and practical application to achieve its objectives. At Flanagan High School, NJROTC is a four-year, four level, course which provides one credit for each year satisfactorily completed. Students are referred to as "Cadets" and will be issued a Naval uniform to wear once a week and will be expected to maintain Naval grooming standards. Cadets who excel in the program will also be promoted using a JROTC rank structure and will be offered positions in the Cadet Battalion Staff. *Lastly, this class is based on many military aspects, cadets have no obligation to join the military*.

Course Description: The NS curriculum focuses on the five NJROTC core content areas: <u>Leadership</u>, <u>Citizenship</u>, <u>Personal Growth and Responsibility</u>, <u>Public Service and Career Exploration</u>, and <u>General Military Subjects</u>. Given this, cadets receive specific classes in leadership, government, history, health and fitness, college and career opportunities, and drill and land navigation (see table below for topics by marking period). To further the learning process, there are also many extracurricular activities for cadets. These activities include Community Service; Drill, Color Guard, Cyber, Academic, Orienteering and Physical Training Teams; leadership camps; and social events.

Course Prerequisites:

- NS I -completion of the eighth grade.
- NS II-IV must successfully complete the previous NS program.

Course Objectives:

- Develop leadership, build character, and create informed and responsible citizens.
- Develop young adults who are physically, mentally, and morally fit.
- Develop civic-minded young adults prepared for both higher education and public service.
- Instill discipline, respect, and responsibility through military-related subjects and activities.

Special Information. This program consists of up to four levels of instruction. Students are required to enroll in this course for a complete school year; NJROTC is not available on a semester basis. Upon successful course completion, students will receive one credit per year.

Grading Policy. Students can earn points in the following disciplines:

- 1. **Academics**. Exams, discussion participation, and quizzes. All class work, to include homework, projects, tests, and all written assignments are to be completed on your own unless specifically directed otherwise by an instructor. Any cadet earning less than a <u>C</u> average should make arrangements with the instructor and parents to improve achievement.
- 2. **Leadership**. Cadets are expected to set a good example in personal behavior, military bearing, and academic performance. Cadets must maintain a 2.5 GPA to be promoted and retain Noncommissioned Officer (NCO) and Officer Ranks. Minor or major infractions will affect the cadet's grade as follows:
 - a. Misbehavior/misconduct equates to the loss of 20/40 points of that day's graded event(s).

- b. In school suspension (ISS) and detention will result in a 50% reduction of that day's graded event(s).
- c. Out of school suspension (OSS) equates to the loss of 100 points of that day's participation grade.
- d. ISS/OSS and detention is an automatic reduction in rank.
- 3. **Uniform and Grooming**. All cadets will be required to adhere to naval grooming standards while enrolled in NJROTC. The Cadet NJROTC uniform will be worn for a quiz grade at minimum twice a month. It must be clean and freshly pressed. No more than two excused absences will be allowed for a designated uniform day each semester. Points are lost for discrepancies (to include bearing) while in uniform. Failure to wear the uniform on the prescribed day will result in a quiz grade of zero unless previously coordinated with the instructor.
- 4. **Official Events:** All a cadets will be required to be participant in at least one "official event/ceremony" each semester for a test grade. Examples: Color Guard, Cake Cutting Ceremony, 911 Remembrance and or other events approved by the SMI and MI.
- 5. Physical Fitness. Students must display effort to improve physical fitness.

Overall Grade: Your overall participation grade will be determined by how you do in the above categories. Everything we will do this school year is designed for you to excel. If you are not wearing your uniform on a consistent basis and not participate in cadet led events, you will not meet the standard.

Late Work: Making up missed or late work is the responsibility of the cadet and NOT the teacher. The cadet, immediately upon his/her return from an absence, must check with his/her teachers for make-up work that may be due. All cadets should complete all assignments on time. When this does not occur, cadets are encouraged to complete all assignments even if they are late. The highest grade for late work is 75%.

- After two missed assignments in a two-week period, we will notify the parent/guardian via progress report, e-mail, or phone call.
- When a pattern of missed assignments is observed, we will contact the cadets' administrator and/or counselor for further intervention.

Re-Take Policy: All cadets have the opportunity to show mastery of content through reassessments on quizzes and other assessments given. In order for a reassessment to be provided, cadets will coordinate the taking of reassessment with one of the NJROTC Instructors and will complete any preparatory assignments associated with the assessment. Cadets who prepare and take reassessments are eligible to receive up to 90% for their grade.

Extra-Credit: Cadets may earn extra credit by completing additional content-based information on quizzes and writing assignments that reinforce and amplify learning objectives. Extra-Credit will be limited to 10 points out of 100 for each assignment.

Promotion. Promotions are an honor and a privilege that can be earned at regular intervals. Promotion is earned by demonstrated achievement in all program disciplines, successful execution of leadership assignment/billets, and demonstrated military growth and maturity. A cadet must pass the Initial Strength Test (IST), have/maintain a 2.0 GPA, work eight hours of community service at each rank, and be able to answer all rank appropriate questions outlined in the cadet handbook.

Community Service. These events are a hallmark of the NJROTC program. Cadets must complete a <u>minimum of five hours</u> <u>per quarter (20 hours of community service per year) for a grade.</u> Cadets are encouraged to participate in out of class service learning and community service projects. Cadets must provide 5 hours of community service each semester. Participation can earn you the NJROTC ribbons and the President's Volunteer Service Award. As you can imagine, our busiest times of the year are around Veteran's Day and Memorial Day. Please ensure you make yourselves available during these long weekends for community events.

Make-up Work. It is the cadet's responsibility to communicate with the teacher on the day he or she returns to class to schedule the makeup of missed work. Cadets are expected to make up all work missed within a time period not to exceed the total number of days absent. Upon their return to class, cadets are expected to turn in any work that was due on the day(s) of absence which was previously assigned. Previously assigned work DOES NOT qualify for extended make-up time.

Academic Integrity: There will be absolutely no tolerance for cheating in any form. Cheating is giving or receiving unauthorized aid on any test, quiz, or assignment. It is important that cadets do their own work in order to maximize their learning.

Attendance: Class attendance and tardy issues will be handled in accordance with the Flanagan High School Attendance Policy. The majority of this course is performance based. Participation is at the core of what is expected of all cadets regardless of their years in the program. Therefore, cadets (cadets) must be present in order to be adequately evaluated. Unexcused absences & unexcused tardy's will adversely affect an individual's grade. Unexcused absences on Uniform and PT days will result in the cadet receiving "0" for that event, in addition to impacting their Leadership/Conduct grade.

DISENROLLMENT POLICY: The SNSI may disenroll a cadet from the NJROTC unit for any of the following reasons:

- Failure to maintain standards of enrollment.
- Lack of aptitude, indifference to training, disciplinary infractions, or undesirable traits of character.
- Disenrollment from school.
- Request of the individual cadet.
- If, in the opinion of the SNSI, the cadet would suffer undue hardship by remaining in the unit for any reason, then disenrollment is authorized.
- Found guilty of a misdemeanor or felony.

We understand that students learn in different ways. Therefore, each instructor will vary their teaching methods in order to best meet the needs of all students. In the rubric above, you can see how much interaction with other cadets plays a huge role in JROTC.

RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

This Release and Hold Harmless Agreement ("Released") is made and entered into as of the date signed below, between the Charles W. Flanagan Navy JROTC Instructors and the undersigned student and parent/guardian.

Navy JROTC programs provide an opportunity for cadets to experience leadership training, confidence building, team building, strength and conditioning, and other developmental opportunities throughout the year including periods when school is not in session. The intent of the training is to develop young men and women to be physically fit, good citizens, who have confidence in themselves. This training comes in various forms, including standard physical fitness training, adventure training, practical application, and classroom instruction. Navy JROTC instructors will never intentionally put your cadet in danger or in a situation where injury could occur; however, "high risk" training, such as rappelling, high rope courses, zip lines, obstacle and confidence courses, swimming and rafting do come with some inherent risk. Ultimately, it is the parents (guardians) decision to allow a cadet to participate and by doing so, you will not hold the instructors liable should injury or death occur.


The following are guidelines for the initial uniform issue, and return policy:

- 1. Upon uniform issue, each cadet will be issued a custody card to be signed by the cadetand returned to the Naval Science classroom upon uniform issue.
- 2. All items must be turned in <u>at the same time</u> in order to facilitate complete and accurate accountability.
- 3. Upon turning in uniforms, your cadet will be issued a "Custody Card Receipt" indicating a cleared NJROTC account.
- 4. It is imperative that your cadet turns in their uniforms <u>directly to the Naval Science Instructors</u> in order for you to receive your Custody Card Receipt which will be your proof of a cleared NJROTC account. Turning in your uniforms to the school office <u>WILL NOT</u> guarantee that your account will be properly cleared.
- 5. If your cadet's uniforms have not been turned in, or the account is not properly cleared, his/her name will appear on the school's "OBLIGATIONS" list the day after disenrollment. *If your cadet is a senior and has an obligation, he/she will not receive their graduation diploma*
