On the positive side of things, we gained eight new members, which included one through baptism—a first for our tenure here! And, we had one wedding and one marriage proposal! Our small groups of AMen, Rubies, Adult Sunday School are thriving, and, although we didn't quite make it to my self-imposed goal of 40 in average weekly worship attendance, we got very close with 39.3!

PUMC is a financially healthy church with no outstanding debt. A silent fund-raising campaign is underway to replace the roof as soon as possible as continual upgrades are made to the physical complex. What continues to be amazing is the generous outpouring of dollars and volunteers from PUMC's membership to the food pantries in Smithville, Plattsburg, and now Trimble, as well as A Turning Point in Gladstone, and Valor Ranch in Lawson. We also have a tithing habit of paying our Conference apportionments ahead of time (usually in January) and supporting the Six Special Giving Sundays of the UMC with substantial contributions.

One of my goals this year was to start a youth program, and with the PUMC Council's guidance and assistance, that is coming to fruition! In December ('25), we offered the new position of PUMC Youth Leader to Erin Clouse of Liberty (the daughter of Liberty UMC pastor, Steve Clouse). She will begin the process soon of setting up a weekly UMYF (United Methodist Youth Fellowship) for our 6th-12th graders. We are very excited about that!

And so, we turn the page into 2026 (it still doesn't look right...). Even though I will be your pastor for only half the year, with God's help it will be one of continued discipleship and fruitfulness, if we make it all for the glory of God. Donna and I would like to thank you for the generous Christmas bonus, and for your many gifts of food, candy, SOCKS and HATS this past Christmas season and throughout the year. Y'all are a delight and a blessing to us!
