

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

The "Father of Methodism," John Wesley, had a methodology for everything.

He had a method for learning called "Societies," what we would call "Churches" today.

He had a method of changing behavior called "Classes." Every member of a Society was, at the same time, a member of a "class" of 10 to 12 people. These classes were mixed as to age, spiritual maturity, gender, marital and social status.

He had a method of changing emotions and motives called "Bands." These were made up of 4 to 6 members of the Societies who wanted to walk more closely with God.

Most of the work of the Society (church) was done in these small discipleship groups, the members of which were accountable one to another about their lives and sins, prayed for each other and encouraged one another to love, good works and holiness. They examined the teachings of the Bible in light of their personal experience, tradition and reason, while new leaders were born and equipped for ministry. These meetings were characterized by an atmosphere of trust, confidence. and encouragement.

It was a great method and it worked! Is it any wonder then the people who subscribed to these methods of following Christ were called "Method-ists?"

The Society known as Paradise United Methodist Church is expanding in the methodical way of Wesley, too. Take a look around the website (ComeToParadise.org) and you will see what I mean.

There is the new Wesleyan Roots study group, which meets every Tuesday evening at 7pm. We had a wonderful turnout for our first of twelve sessions last Tuesday, as we learn what makes United Methodists distinct.

The men's service group known as "The AMen" meets every first Saturday morning at 8am for breakfast, a short devotional, fellowship, and a little business. Our first mission project was building a wheelchair ramp and we are open to suggestions for service projects in all parts of our mission field.

While the men are meeting on Saturday morning, as of this writing the women were planning to meet at a local eatery for a group fellowship and devotional (led by Tammy Krause). I can see this becoming a regular thing.

The Prayer Group is an ongoing Bible study and prayer session which meets each Tuesday morning at 9am.

The Adult Sunday School class meets each Sunday morning at 9:45am. Right now, they are deep into a study of Romans.

These small groups are totally Wesleyan! In them you will find mutual encouragement and understanding, a call to accountability, and realize what it means to be a working member of the Kingdom right now! I encourage you to find one you like or start your own.

It is totally a Methodist thing to do!

We also have an ongoing opportunity to help at the Smithville Food Pantry on the first Tuesday of every month at the Christian Church in Smithville. The times are from 830-11am and duties include sacking groceries, assisting clients out with the items they have selected, etc. There is a sign-up sheet on the back counter in the sanctuary. The July volunteers are Kirk & Susan Jessen.

For July we will collect canned vegetables for the Smithville Food Pantry. They have requested NO corn or green beans, as they have a donor who provides those items for them. Items may be left on the table in the far end of the family center. Also on the table is a white container for a monetary collection for the Plattsburg Food Pantry. They are connected with a food bank in St. Joseph and prefer cash donations.

The recap of June collections: 52 boxes of cereal, 6 paper towels, 2 cans of soup, 1 cake mix, 1 jiffy corn bread mix, 2 envelopes brown gravy, 1 bag of pinto beans and a bag of potato flakes for the Smithville Food Pantry, and \$200 for the Plattsburg pantry. We also collected \$275 for the Christmas store at Grace Community Church. Thank you for your generosity.
