

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

The July 4th holiday was anything but joyous to those who lost friends and family to devastating floods in south Texas. The destructive fast-moving waters that began before sunrise that Friday in the Texas Hill Country killed at least 80 people and an unknown number remain missing. Those still unaccounted for included 27 girls from Camp Mystic, a Christian summer camp along the Guadalupe River in Kerr County where most of the dead were recovered.

We as Christians and humanitarians ask, "what can we do?" The best thing we can do at this point is through UMCOR (United Methodist Committee On Relief). UMCOR is providing support to the Texas disaster through financial grants, Early Response Teams (ERTs), and material assistance. They are working with the Rio Texas Conference and other partners to address immediate needs.

UMCOR has awarded solidarity grants to the Rio Texas Conference to assist with their response efforts to the flooding. Early Response Teams (ERTs) have been dispatched and are coordinating efforts to help with debris removal, tarping roofs, and cleaning out homes in the impacted areas. Resources like flood buckets and other essential items are being gathered.

UMCOR's disaster response will continue throughout the recovery process, including home repairs and rebuilding efforts. Long-term collaboration will continue with local churches, the Rio Texas Conference and other partners to provide comprehensive support.

So, how might we at PUMC help? We have already helped some with our UMCOR Sunday contributions which pay for running the program. With those costs taken care of, 100% of

donations made now will be put into the relief effort. Donations can be made to the Rio Texas Conference Disaster Fund Annual (https://riotexasresponse.org/take-action) or to UMCOR Advance #901670 (https://umcmission.org/about-the-advance/) to UMCOR's U.S. disaster support response.
