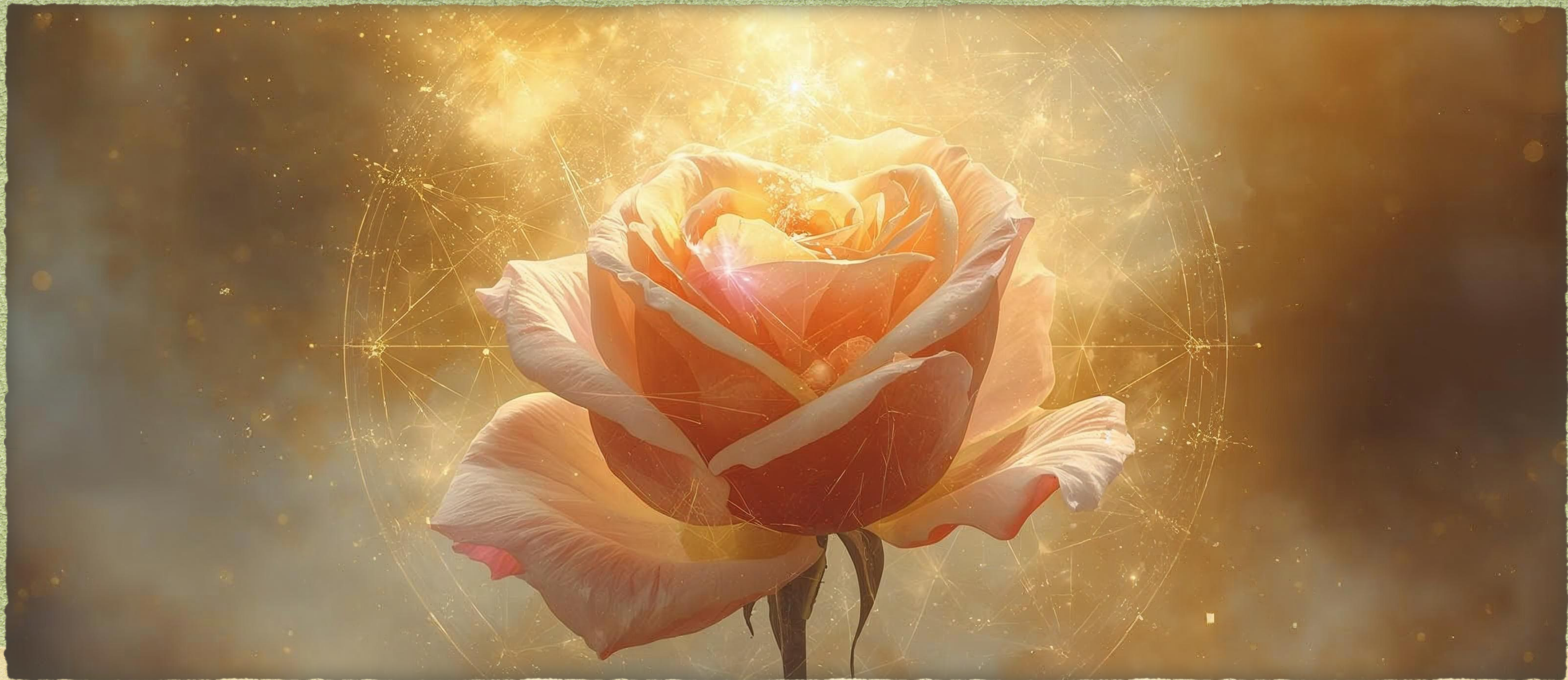

Mary Magdalene & the Gnostic Gospels



➤ Earliest references of Mary Magdalene appear from two different sources:

1. Canonical Gospels of the New Testament (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John)
2. A group of fringe materials known as the Gnostic Gospels which were rejected by the Roman Catholic Church

➤ In 325, Constantine (the emperor of Rome) convened the Council of Nicaea where it was decided which texts would become the standards of the Church - now known as the canonical Gospels

➤ Some texts survived!

➤ In 1945 a large clay jar containing texts was found in the desert at Nag Hammadi in Egypt. The contents of this jar have become known as the Gnostic Gospels. These include the *Gospel of Thomas* and *The Gospel of Philip*

➤ One of the papyrus books from the jar even found its way into the possession of Carl Jung!

➤ Gnostic comes from the Greek word *gnosis* meaning “inner knowing”. Gnosticism is the belief that spiritual development comes through ‘inner knowing, self-acquaintance, self-knowledge’ or ‘direct knowing’. KNOW THYSELF

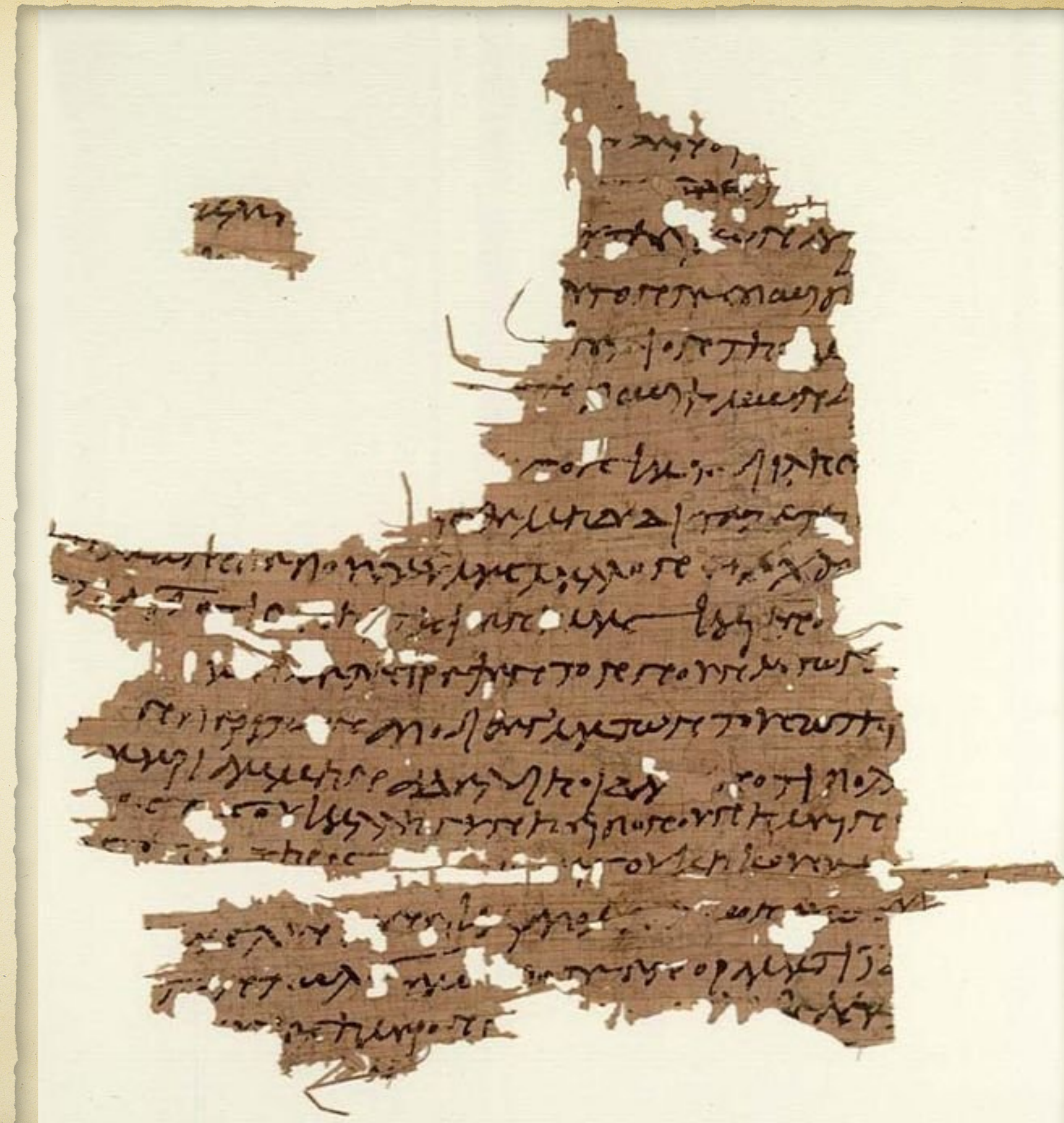
Why was Mary known as a prostitute?

- In 591, Pope Gregory gave a sermon (Homily 33) in which he declared that Mary was a penitent whore
- Jesus had to cast out “seven demons” to heal her for being a “sinner”
- This was actually an initiation! Clearing of the 7 chakras and in my opinion the rising of the Kundalini and a transformation
- In essence Mary was erased from the main narrative of Christianity and women’s voices were silenced
- In 1969 the Church officially separated Mary Magdalene from the other women she had been merged with
- It was not until 2016 that the Church finally recognized Mary as the “Apostle to the Apostles” - but many in the Church still see her as a prostitute - Father Timothy Uniac - Priest I met advocating for Mary Magdalene
- She was the only one present at both the Crucifixion and the Resurrection. And she was told by Jesus to “go and tell” the others

- The *Gospel of Philip* and the *Dialogue of the Saviour* discuss the divine feminine as the bearer of secret knowledge
- Mary Magdalene is portrayed as the most advanced disciple “a woman who knew ALL.” She received the most advanced teachings from Jesus
- The companion of the Anointed of God [Messiah, Christ] is Mary the Magdalene. The Master loved Mary more than all the disciples and he kissed her on the mouth many times. The others saw his love for Mary and asked him, “Why do you love her more than all of us?” - *The Gospel of Philip*
- Another Gnostic source, the *Pistis Sophia*, depicts Mary Magdalene as his most advanced and chosen disciple
- Today she is recognized as Saint Mary Magdalene and her Feast Day is July 22nd



The Gospel of Mary Magdalene



- The *Gospel of Mary Magdalene* was found in Egypt in 1896
- Publication was delayed until 1955 due to several world wars
- The *Gospel of Mary Magdalene* is not complete
 - Pages 1–6 are missing
 - Pages 7–10 survive (discussion between Mary and the disciples after Christ's departure)
 - Pages 11–14 are missing
 - Pages 15–19 survive (Mary recounts a vision of the soul's ascent through seven powers or veils)
- Mary teaches the disciples what Jesus didn't teach them but they were jealous that he chose her especially because she was a woman!

Core Teachings in the Surviving Gospel

1. The Soul's Liberation

Mary describes a vision where the soul ascends through seven oppressive powers (e.g., Darkness, Desire, Ignorance). Each must be overcome to reach spiritual freedom. These are not demons in a literal sense, but psychological and spiritual states that block gnosis.

2. Inner Authority over External Law

Mary says the "Son of Man" (Christ) did not come to create new laws, but to dissolve the false authorities of the world. Liberation comes not from obeying outer institutions, but from listening to the divine light within.

3. The Importance of Inner Vision and Love

Mary reveals that Christ communicated to her not through physical resurrection but through a soul-level encounter in the light realms. His teachings to her emphasize compassion, inner peace, and unity with the divine.

4. Mary as the Bearer of Hidden Mysteries and Secret Knowledge

Peter and the male disciples challenge her authority "How is it possible that the Teacher spoke in this manner with this woman about secrets of which we ourselves are ignorant? Must we change our customs and listen to this woman? Did he really prefer her to us?". But, she stands her ground, sharing the teachings she received directly from Christ in a vision. Levi defends her, saying, "Surely the Saviour knew her well. That is why he loved her more than us."

In the gospel, Mary speaks not only of teachings given to her by Jesus but also of the deeper mysteries of the soul, the union of light and shadow, the integration of the body and spirit.

There is a special emphasis on the **Divine Feminine** as the key to accessing this sacred knowledge and embodiment. The wisdom she shares invites us to reconnect with the sacred and forgotten aspect of ourselves - the part that is the embodiment of love, light, and deep spiritual insight.

She teaches that Heaven is not somewhere to reach after death, but a **state of being** that we are meant to **anchor in the present moment** within our bodies, our hearts, and our world. This resonates with the Christed path of bringing Heaven to Earth. The Christ Consciousness that Magdalene embodies is not just transcendent but also deeply rooted, existing in the here and now, within the body and the earth.

In this teaching, the **Divine Feminine** reveals the path of inner transformation, where we not only ascend but also **descend**, grounding divine wisdom into the physical world. It's a marriage of the higher and lower, spirit and matter, Heaven and Earth.

The **light of the soul** that Mary speaks of is also the very essence of the **Divine Feminine**, representing the nurturing, transformative, and sustaining power of love, which is felt in every interaction, every cell, and every breath. It is this love that brings heaven into the mundane, that allows us to witness the sacred in every moment.

Mary Magdalene was not simply a follower

She was a woman deeply connected to the living presence of Christ consciousness.

Some Quotes from The Teacher (Jesus) in The Gospel of Mary Magdalene

- There is no sin. It is you who make sin exist.
- This is why you become sick, and why you die
- Attachment to matter gives rise to passion against nature. Thus trouble arises in the whole body; this is why I tell you: 'Be in harmony...'
- If you are out of balance, take inspiration from manifestation of your true nature
- Your true nature being your soul, your light. The soul is eternal. The body is simply a vessel. Everything outside of that is an illusion. Don't become attached to matter, body, identity, emotions.
