How to Handle Them:

All boat "Cruise Ins" and/or reservations must be done through the Port Captain (Paul Schlotfeldt) or the Assistant Port Captain (Danny Ahern).

Upon arriving, the Boat's Captain must sign the log book. The log book is located in the podium under the member and guest sign-in book. No one shall write in it except The P.C., Assist. P.C and the boat captain.

All reservations taken by the Port Captain or the Assistant P.C. will be recorded in the log book by the P.C. or Assistant P.C. NO EXCEPTIONS.



July 27, 1948 - June 12, 2015

Murni was buried in a Moslem service that reflected the cross-cultural life she lived. 
