

# Working Equitation Lancefield Districts Inc (W.E.L.D.)

## **New Member Information**

Working Equitation Lancefield Districts Inc. (W.E.L.D.) is a club of likeminded adults who foster an environment of camaraderie, support and fun. The club is built around the principles of classical horsemanship, developing the partnership between horse and rider, and building partnerships between members.

W.E.L.D. was founded in July 2021. It is affiliated with Australian National Working Equitation Limited (ANWE) who is the official governing body for working equitation in Australia having signed a Protocol Agreement with the World Association of Working Equitation in 2016.

The discipline of working equitation was created to celebrate the partnership between horse and rider with a focus on versatility, agility, athleticism and training. Open to all breeds of horse and levels of rider, Australian National Working Equitation upholds the principles of classical dressage.

Working equitation was pioneered by four countries: Italy, Portugal, Spain, and France, with the first International competition being held in 1996. In 2004, the World Association for Working Equitation was established to govern the sport internationally. Since that time, the sport has continued to grow around the world.

Working Equitation competitions have four phases.

- Phase 1: Working Dressage: Riders showcase the partnership and their level of training in a working dressage test conducted on a 40 x 20 metre dressage arena.
- Phase 2: Maneability: Riders negotiate a course of obstacles which replicate what they would
  encounter doing farm or stock work, or out on a ride. This phase is judged on style and accuracy.
- Phase 3: Maneability Speed: This is an obstacle course that is judged on speed and accuracy.
- Phase 4: Team Cattle Yarding: (optional phase) Working Equitation features a unique cattle event which is something of a cross between cutting, drafting and team yarding. Riders work as a team of 4 to showcase the versatility of their working horse.

Some clubs are just beginning to introduce cattle and not all competitions include the Cattle Phase yet and it is still optional depending on the level you choose to compete.

At W.E.L.D. we have a great group of friendly members and a strict code of conduct which we believe will guide our club to become a strong social club. On club days we ask members to bring a shared lunch and we take the time to sit together and connect. We like to support each other during rallies and at competitions.

### Uniform

Official base club colour is red with white and navy trims/offset/pipping and denim or navy coloured pants/jodhpurs.

We do not have uniform items for sale as yet - members are encouraged to purchase items that are aligned with the uniform policy and are comfortable for themselves and horse

### Club Days:

Our Club Days are held on the 3rd Saturday of each month in Lancefield or surrounding areas, on occasions we may have club days on the 1st Saturday of the month.

We aim to offer a variety of club days, but our goal is to have consistency with our coaches:

- Casual obstacle practice days
- Dressage/flat coaching days
- Maneability coaching days
- Cattle clinic day

The structure of each club day will normally consist of group sessions, the length of which will vary depending on the instructor, focus of the day and number of members attending.

Lessons with instructors are priced between \$85 - \$120 (inclusive of facility fee\_ depending on instructor. Bookings for club days will be via TryBooking.com and are on a first in basis.

During club days we have to continue to follow the Australian National Working Equitation rules.

### Membership:

We currently offer adult membership (18+) for \$65 and junior membership (12 to under 18s) for \$40.

You will also require an ANWE membership, which is the National body for Working Equitation in Australia. If you are not already a member of ANWE the cost of this registration is \$35 per year.

The membership year is from 1st July to 30th June. .

Please note, in accordance with club policy, all applications require committee approval. In the unlikely event an application is not approved, a full refund of fees will be provided. W.E.L.D. reserves the right to deny membership at any time without reason.

W.E.L.D. has the right to revoke any person's membership at any time if the committee deems fit to do so.
