Greetings Parishioners,

This fall I plan on offering servers training and Eucharistic minister training. To minister at the holy Mass is a special gift that God gives us. To take part and honor the Lord through service is a privilege from Christ that helps us grow in holiness.

Are you interested in being a Eucharistic minister? Are you or your child interested in being an altar server? If so, please email me at jsmith@toledodiocese.org and I will send out an email in the next couple of weeks to find a good training date and time for both ministries.

A Eucharistic Minister is a parishioner, selected by the Pastor and mandated by the Bishop, who serves, distributes, and administers the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ during the Holy Communion or Eucharist of the Church Service. In the Catholic Mass, they are referred to more accurately as "Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion" (the "ordinary" minister being the priest celebrant).

Eucharistic Ministers are called not only to minister the Body and Blood of Christ, but to have and maintain a strong faith, a sense of awe, and an inclusiveness of others as the foundation for their ministry. The ministers accomplish this by strengthening their faith from within and sharing it with the faithful at communion time. Eucharistic Ministers must be comfortable in establishing a relationship with each communicant in what is most likely the most intimate moment in the liturgy.

Some Eucharistic Ministers may also feel called to bring Holy Communion to people within the parish community who are sick and/or homebound. The experience in bringing the Body of Christ to others, who can not attend mass due to illness or other limitations, is truly a gift from God.


Father Jeff opened with a prayer.

PARISHIONER JAKE RIETSCHLIN

BETHLEHEM – Jake and Jessica Rietschlin started Field of Screams on J and J Rietschlin Farm with their children, Nathan and Grace, four years ago. Their farm is located at 5482 State Route 61 South in Shelby.

"We originally started with the family/kid-friendly corn maze" nine years ago, Jake clarified. After five years of asking Jessica to start a haunted corn maze, she agreed.

Unlike previous years, though, "we are doing a kid-friendly, self-serve corn maze during the day and a haunted corn maze at night," noted Jake.

The day maze will be open 7 days a week, from 1:00 pm to dusk until October 31 for \$5 per person. The haunted maze is open from 7:30pm until the last ticket is sold at 11pm on Friday and Saturdays until October 31. Purchase a \$20 ticket in-person or on Fear Ticket.

The cost of the day maze includes games and other activities on the farm.

"It will not include hay rides this year," said Jake. In addition to a combine slide, there will be a sand box, a 50 foot long tire ride and different games "Jessie puts out throughout the farm for the kids."

"Adults have fun, too," he emphasized, "not just kids."

Guests will see an assortment of pre-picked pumpkins to choose from. "They're marked as priced," Jake noted, and there will be a jar for cash.

Visitors can admire three horses while petting them.

A grain farmer when he's not a K-9 officer for the Mansfield Police Department, "we're going to have our Gleaner combine out," Jake said. "Kids can climb up in it. We also have smaller tractors to play on."

Jake and Jessica have tapped their daughter, Grace, to coordinate school field trips this year.

Sacred Heart School and close to 20 others are planned. "She's going to be busy," Jake shared.

Their oldest child, "Nathan helps with our IT/computer" needs, noted Jake. "He is one of our actors as Michael Myers," the main character in Halloween, a horror film series.

It's been an all-hands family business anchored in their love for Christ.

Before opening night on Saturday, September 20, "we were Blessed to have our Pastors out, to pray over and Bless our Haunted Corn Maze and Kid-Friendly Maze," J & J Field of Screams posted on Facebook. "Thank you FrJeffery Smith and Pastor Greg Griffith. We appreciate you both!"

"My wife and I stress to people that we are a Christian family," Jake added. "We stress to our actors that we are a Christian family: Nothing demonic, nothing that will bring evil to our family."

The Rietschlins hire teenagers and adults who have a passion for scaring people. "We have 27 actors and three tractor drivers," Jake confirmed.

The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few, Jesus taught.

"Some of these people never heard of the Lord before us; they come from pretty rough homes," Jake explained. "We pray before the start of the night for a safe night. After each night, we have a family-style dinner. We pray over the meal for blessed food."

The maze is a year-long operation. "We start planning it in January – our family and two of our managers – I draw what we want," noted Jake.

A fellow parishioner, Owen Niese of R and R Niese Farms, plants the crop using a GPS Corn Planter.

"We start setting things up usually in July and August," Jake said. "Jessica is my right hand woman and we wouldn't be able to do this without each other."

Jake's home is generational.

"My grandpa and grandma, Louis and Nellie Rietschlin, bought the place in 1936. When they passed away, my dad bought it; I bought it from him," he said.

"Sacred Heart is the cornerstone of our family," Jake noted. One of the church's earliest pioneers, "Simon Metzger was my great grandpa. The Rietschlins were also one of the founders."

The ties that bind Sacred Heart are eternal.

"I'll never leave 'til they put me in the cemetery," Jake said.
