

September 13 - Adult Choir


October 5 - Family Choir - Kids are welcome.

# PARISHIONERS SETH AND MAYCEE RIETSCHLIN

BETHLEHEM - The Heart of Bethlehem beats strong for two high school sweethearts.

Seth and Maycee Rietschlin married almost 12 years ago. Their oldest child, Oliver, was ready to start preschool in 2021 when they recognized the school was in need of structural improvements.

"We truly realized – at least I did because Seth already knew Sacred Heart was great – how amazing it is and we just want to do anything to help it stick around a lot longer," Maycee said.

Along with Seth and Maycee, the Heart of Bethlehem consists of parishioners from many walks of life. It was "formed to help ensure that a strong Catholic Education will continue to be provided at Sacred Heart School for many generations to come," according to Lisa Myers, Sacred Heart School's principal.

Some of the projects have been small, while others will transform the school. Given the scope of its' needs, an architectural firm was hired to help.

"They basically did an audit of the school, grounds and the buildings and compiled a list of everything," Seth noted.

All monies raised will be accounted for, Maycee explained. "I want people to know that we are really taking into account every penny that's donated." The Heart of Bethlehem regularly consults the Finance Committee and Father Jeff, "making sure that everything goes to great use, no waste."

Various maintenance projects have already been completed.

"We haven't done anything that didn't already need done," added Seth.

Completed projects include: new gym floors and fresh paint; all lights are now LED; closed circuit tv/security camera system; new floors in the hallway, painted the school, tuck pointed the school, sealed the school.

Along with many electrical upgrades, Seth said, "we replaced the water heater - but that was on the list of things to do, anyway."

Moving forward, "we recently got water lines in – we can do a new water system for the whole facility. That's in the works right now," noted Seth.

Looking to get rid of iron in the water, "We want to put a treatment system in," Seth shared, which will require new piping.

The original goal isn't lost.

"The main project was to get the kids out of the basement," Maycee added. "Maybe get the teachers more space to continue doing the amazing things they do."

The Heart of Bethlehem is an ongoing list of projects and there is no end date.

"As long as people keep donating and we keep having ideas, I don't think we'll see an end; I'd like it to carry over to the next generation," Maycee said.

"If the day does come when we do an addition — we plan on putting ballots out — we will get input from the parish, it's not something we're just going to do," Seth said.

The architect will help facilitate that process through a town hall-like meeting, Maycee added.

Seth, a 7th generation member of the parish, brought Maycee to Sacred Heart early in their relationship.

"On our second date, he took me to Mass. I had no idea what he meant when he was like, 'we're going to Mass before dinner.' I was just going with it," Maycee laughed.

It wasn't her first time inside Sacred Heart, though.

"I was at a family wedding at Sacred Heart when I was about 8 years old," Maycee recalled. "I looked at my parents and I said, 'I want to get married here' and I did! Sacred Heart has been the center of our relationship."

A generational parishioner, "I've never been anywhere else," Seth said. "It's where I want my kids to go. It's a big part of me."

The parents of three kids – Oliver, 8, Emery, 5 and Nellie Maye, 3 – Seth and Maycee have firmly laid down their roots in the Settlement.

"Not being from Sacred Heart made me appreciate how special it is," Maycee said. "I just want to give back because I feel that Sacred Heart has given me so much."

Maycee joined Sacred Heart Church two years ago in what is now called OCIA – Order of Christian Initiation for Adults – but she has been attending church with Seth since their second date.

The Rietschlins also serve at Sacred Heart Baseball, reflecting their early love.

"We met in high school on the baseball/softball bus," Maycee reminisced. "We've both always liked it and it's something fun we like doing with our kids."
