


Sacred Heart of Jesus Feast Day: June 27th.

FATHER JEFF SMITH

BETHLEHEM – The third Sunday of June celebrates fatherhood. Father Jeff has been the spiritual father of Sacred Heart and Saint Joseph since July 2020.

The needs of a church are as different as the men, women and children in its pews.

Instructing the faithful is vital. Through the homily, he can "teach as a good father would teach his son or daughter," Fr. Jeff shared.

Simple advice invites parishioners to be more receptive.

"Not too complicated, make it understandable so the kids can learn," noted Fr. Jeff. "Nothing too groundbreaking, but always simple lessons as a father would teach his child."

Students at both parishes benefit. St. John Paul II articulated a Theology of the Body that Father Jeff teaches.

"One year I teach it at Sacred Heart, one year I teach it at St. Joe's," explained Father Jeff. "I teach it once a month for a couple hours about nine times a year."

Utilizing a workbook and a few videos, "I teach the kids how to be a proper gift of self and how to receive gifts properly," Fr. Jeff said. The lessons instruct them "how to receive love and how to give love."

The ideas are applicable to youngsters, he added. "I try to give real life examples so they can understand," he added.

Lessons from his own father lead him today.

"My dad always says that if I ever make you work, I won't make you do it alone," noted Fr. Jeff. "That was a lesson that he learned from his dad, as well. If he asked me to feed the pigs or the steers, he would be by my side doing it," Fr. Jeff shared.

Always ready to pitch in, Fr. Jeff said, "For example, if I ask people to set up for the festival, I try to be there with them if I'm able."

Father Jeff inherited both grandfathers' work ethic.

"One was a farmer, one was a painter," noted Father Jeff. "I always worked with my grandfather when we would shingle roofs or paint. Same with my other grandpa – he'd always be there on the farm watching me work or being with me and helping out."

All of his grandparents have passed away, but "I still have that communion with them in the Communion of the Saints – we're still connected," Fr. Jeff shared.

Especially during Mass.

"I usually have my grandparents in mind for the petitions of the deceased, and the different prayers in the missal," he noted.

Pastoring two parishes means dividing his time, leading his flock.

"I try to give the appropriate amount of time to both parishes," Fr. Jeff explained. "It can be an example for a family if they're tempted to choose the son that's a better athlete – or their daughter that has better grades – to be their favorite."

Mother Teresa of Calcutta once noted, "I'm called not to be successful, but to be faithful."

God, the eternal Father, cherishes all creation.

"How I act portrays how the heavenly Father cares for His people," said Father Jeff. "To live the example of Jesus and the heavenly Father points out how the Father loves us."

Heart of Bethlehem Meeting

April 29, 2025

Met in library of school. Meeting started at 7:40. Father opened with prayer.

Old Business:

Seth opened by reviewing the projects completed to date by the Heart of Bethlehem (See meeting agenda). There have been regular weekly donations to the HOB ranging from \$40 to \$10,000. As of now there is \$79,760.25 in the HOB account- This amount is after all projects have been paid for.

New Business

Rosie Sutter and Steve Vogt. This meeting was held in general to refresh everyone on the projects that have been completed, to discuss projects in works and to make the parish aware that the Heart of Bethlehem is still active and planning. Joe DiLullo is going to do a settlement spotlight on the HOB to get word out of the goals and projects we are working on. Father has submitted a letter to the diocese to try to approve a water renovation for the entire campus.

The Diocese meets in June and it is hoped we can complete this project this summer (2025).

Stefanie Kuntz and Lil Niese have been added to the committee to replace the vacancies of

The water renovation consists of a small building over the well housing a softener system, new lines to all buildings and fixtures- replacement of all water lines. Tom has a connection that will draw up computer aided drawings for Seth to submit to the Health department. They are going to get the plans done and submitted to Richland County Health Department for approval so that when/ if the Diocese approves, they can start immediately. The Settlement Settlers will be

when/ if the Diocese approves, they can start immediately. The Settlement Settlers will be covering the expense of the water project, which is an approximate \$140,000. There are thoughts to have a booth at the festival to make people aware of the committee. Discussion was made about some of the group's goals and projects that have been completed. After May 1 st we are able to fund raise but it was agreed by the group that we are not to that point. A meeting was scheduled for June 3 d in the school. Seth will reach out to Joe to see if he can come to the

meeting to see what information we would like to highlight in the Settlement Spotlight. Father

closed with a prayer and meeting was adjourned approximately 8:20 PM.
