Dear Parishioners,

This week we are reminded to pray for vocations! You might be thinking: "No it is a day to pray for mothers!!" Well, we are both correct because being a wife and mother is certainly a vocation from God. Yes, today is "Mother's Day" but it is also "World Day of Prayer for Vocations". God indeed calls people to serve the Church in different ways and if we follow God's call, we will be the most fulfilled.

If we follow God's call, indeed we are literally doing what we were created to do. Often folks don't even think about what God wants out of them. Let's put an end to that and pray that our young people listen to the voice of God concerning their life's calling. What God calls them to will bring them the most fulfillment. Who doesn't want their child to live a fulfilled life!!? Let us help the youth by increasing our prayers for holy vocations.

How do we pray for vocations? Our vocation director Fr. David Kidd advises that we pray 1 extra "Hail Mary" each day for an increase in vocations to the priesthood in the Diocese of Toledo. Another great way to pray is by offering your sufferings to God for an increase in vocations. Often as we age our sufferings increase, but these sufferings can be transformed and offered up for vocations. Here is a prayer that might interest you:

"Lord Jesus, You willingly suffered a painful death for the sake of my salvation. Today I join my pain with Yours- my illness, my loneliness, my heartache- all for an increase in vocations to the priesthood. Have pity on your servant, Lord, for to you I lift up my soul! Amen.

BETHLEHEM – Four-generations of women call Sacred Heart home.

Sacred Heart "means just about everything," Mary Studer noted. "All the friendships we've had. The people."

Mary's husband was Charles Studer.

Joyce, Mary's daughter, reflected on her 70 years as a parishioner.

"When I go to church on Sundays, it makes me feel closest to my dad. He passed away 22 years ago," Joyce shared.

Ever since Joyce's childhood, the family has sat in the back pew.

"We always sat up front when the kids were little," Mary clarified. "When Dad got sick, the doctor told him not to go to Church unless he had to – and if he had to – sit in the back so he couldn't get so many germs."

Charles started Studer Electric.

"Papa was the electrician at the church before anybody else," added Bridget Milligan, Mary's granddaughter.

"I wish I could've met Papa," said Charlyce Milligan, Mary's great-granddaughter. "I'm named after him."

"Papa was the rock of the family," Bridget said. "Mama is the matriarch."

Mary has 4 daughters and a son. "We feel very privileged to have Mama in our lives," said Bridget. "She passes down a lot of things – everything from sourdough baking, gardening, fermented tea, sewing, and stained glass making."

All three of Bridget's children with her husband of 22 years, Dusty Milligan – Lincoln, Charly and Declan – were baptized in the parish and attended Sacred Heart School.

Joyce was no stranger to students when her kids were in school; she previously served as the librarian.

It is a nice school to attend, said Joyce, "Small classes, good teachers."

"My main motivation for moving back was to raise my kids at Sacred Heart," said Bridget. "That's where my mom, all of my aunts and uncle, went to school."

A famous merry-go-round used to be on the playground.

"In fact," Joyce proudly noted, "Bridget photographed it and a picture is hanging up in the school."

"My husband and I help out with Sacred Heart Baseball," noted Bridget. "I try to do every field trip, every class party; anytime Mrs. Myers asks me to do schoolwide photos – I'm always there."

Currently a sophomore in high school, "I went to Sacred Heart from preschool to eighth grade," Charly said.

"I am a server," Charly noted. "I was in the kids choir – I was in pretty much everything Sacred Heart had," including spring concerts and Christmas plays.

"We connected God to everything. That's what I model my life by – It gave me an example of what I am supposed to do," said Charly.

Small class sizes allow individual attention.


"I had only ten kids in my class. We were a chosen family – not related ... Actually," Charly said with a knowing smile, "most kids are related."
