## From Rev. Haydie

“O God, our times are in your hand.” Our birthday prayers often start that way. These words from Psalm 31 serve as an important reminder that **we’re** not the ones in control, no matter how hard we work and plan. Even our greatest accomplishments come by God’s grace.

If we were in any danger of forgetting that, 2024 seems pretty determined to remind us. Here at Trinity it’s sometimes felt like a year of endless canceling and rescheduling. Most recently, the harvest supper planned for earlier this month has been moved to October 23. It’s a potluck and there will, of course, be a signup sheet—but the most important thing you can bring is yourself! There will be plenty of food, so please join us in the Parish Hall.

Our plan to keep the church open for prayer on Election Day, meanwhile, has been complicated by a jury duty summons (mine). The church will still be open at lunchtime and in the evening; Joe Crupper will still lead Compline at night. If we can open the building at other times, we’ll let you know.

But these are small glitches. We look at communities devastated by the path of hurricane Helene, by war and fire and civil unrest. The people living in them had plans, too. They had houses and roads and electricity and right now, many of those things are just... gone. And members of Trinity’s church family are facing their own challenges, their own losses.

In our times of plenty as well as our times of need, I hope we remember that we are always in God’s hands. I hope we can rejoice in our blessings and share them with those most in need. May we place our whole trust in the God “whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine.”

## New Presiding Bishop

The church will celebrate the investiture of its 28th Presiding Bishop, The Rt. Rev. Sean Rowe, in a livestreamed service on November 2. It's a great chance to stay in your pajamas on a Saturday morning... raise a cup of coffee, and perhaps a festive muffin... and share in the life of our larger church.

The service will be held in the chapel of the church's New York offices. Previous investitures have taken place in big cathedral services with thousands of attendees, but this simpler, scaled-down service will be ordered around a smaller carbon footprint and increased churchwide virtual engagement.

A prelude showcasing the rich mosaic of The Episcopal Church will kick off at 7:30 our time with a video "roll call" of dioceses. The service itself will begin at 9:00.
