From Rev. Haydie

Repentance. Forgiveness. Hope. They're important themes, and we've been hearing them since Lent began. We hear them at Morning Prayer, at Communion, and Compline. We hear them in our scripture readings, in our prayers, in our sermons and hymns. They remind us of God's love for us and our world.

But I think they can also steer us wrong. These words are very abstract, and our experience of Lent... isn't supposed to be abstract! From the first evening we come to the altar to get our foreheads marked with ashes, this is a season that reminds us—relentlessly—of what it means to be human, to have bodies subject to hunger and pain and decay.

Our readings in this season remind us of Jesus's own hunger in the wilderness. They tell us about the Prodigal Son's near-starvation in a land struck by famine. They remember ordinary people crushed by a falling tower and others murdered by the Roman state. They will take us to Jesus's own beating and crucifixion and death, and they will dare us to look away.

But they'll also show us the father in Jesus's parable who rushes to wrap his best robe around his starving son. They'll show us Mary of Bethany, washing Jesus's feet with the finest ointment she can buy. And on Maundy Thursday we'll see Jesus himself bend down to wash the disciples' feet. "Just as I have loved you," he'll say, "you also should love one another."

Throughout Lent, the suffering bodies in our readings point us to the suffering bodies in our world: the homeless and hungry, the burned-out and bombed-out, the sick and the dying and imprisoned. Jesus tells us to look at **those** bodies, to care for **those** bodies as though they were our own—or his. "Truly I tell you," he says, "whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

PWCC Update

It's been a busy time for Trinity's outreach ministry to the residents at the Pocatello Women's Correctional Center (PWCC). We received approval for an Easter Service at the facility and plans to make it special are in the works. Another eight week Courage for My Life class was celebrated with treats and certificates by six graduates. Completion of training and planning is underway for a new class to be presented to the residents of PWCC in the near future. The Bridges To Life is a fourteen week "faith-based restorative justice program with the mission to bring peace into offenders' lives while they are incarcerated and reduce recidivism." Reading assignments, written response to questions and participating in open dialogue are requirements for graduation. Please keep us in your prayers as we venture into new opportunities to bring God's love to the residents. Thank you for your continued support of the ministry.

She also asked us to help with dessert at the closing dinner for Feeding the 5000 on April 12. We need bakers for regular and gluten free cookies. These may be dropped off at the LDS church across from Caldwell Park or at Trinity parish hall. Rita will deliver those left at the church.

Other activities were discussed. Pie & Polish was planned for March 25 to get the brass candlesticks, etc. polished and ready for Easter. We also discussed the baby shower for McKenna Grace on March 29. You may still drop off diapers or gifts at the church if you missed the shower. Miffy will be glad to deliver them.

Our Easter activity will be filling Easter bags for the children who come to church on Easter Sunday. We need Easter candy for older children and small wrapped snacks for toddlers since chocolate filled plastic eggs won’t do for the little ones. The next meeting of ECW will be April 19 at 11:00 in the parish hall. We will be making Easter bags for our children and cleaning the grounds and planting flowers for Easter. All are welcome!
