I really have two separate sets of thoughts this month. Let's start with this one and turn to page four for the second!

And now it's Lent. Lent is a season of "prayer, fasting, and self-denial": a season of looking at our lives and asking what changes might help us draw closer to God. Of trying out some of those changes, perhaps, and seeing how they work for us.

Admittedly, fasting and self denial aren't an easy sell at the best of times! This year, moreover, Lent comes amid real political and economic upheaval. Many of us have urgent concerns about our own and our neighbors' futures. Just reading the news can feel like all the Lent some of us can tolerate.

Many faithful people have responded with Lenten disciplines shaped by this historical moment. Some are "fasting" from social media, for example, with all its divisiveness and alarmism, or from particular kinds of consumer activity. Others have pushed themselves to take on new political or volunteer activities, recommitting themselves to serving as Christ's heart and hands.

But I hope we all turn to God in prayer. Indeed, that's why Trinity's main Lenten observance this year is the lovely service of Sung Compline. Amid all the cares and concerns of our lives, this ancient liturgy invites us to rest in God's eternal changelessness. It's a short service—less than half an hour—shared after a soup supper on alternate Wednesdays. It invites us into a shadowy church, the evening sun streaming through the windows as candles glow from the chancel. It invites us to quiet our minds and to lift our hearts with the singers' voices. "Bless the Lord," they will sing, as they remind us to trust in the God who alone is the source of all peace. I hope you'll join us!

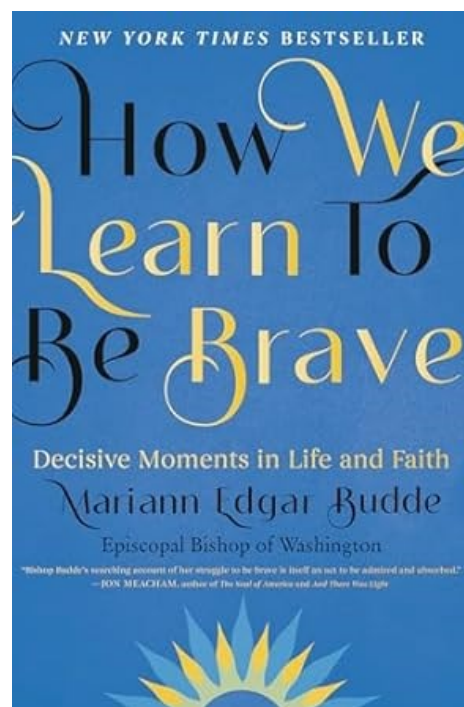

March 31 will be Trans Day of Visibility, as it is every year. Here in Pocatello there will be a gathering a few days before, organized by and for the trans community. Mostly younger people will come. And most of the rest of us, being neither young nor trans, won't pay a lot of attention.

Alas, it's probably safest for those attending if the larger community **doesn't** pay much attention. This year's gathering will focus on joy and affirmation, but it will do so in an increasingly hostile civic environment. In communities across this country, proposed or pending legislation is threatening and often terminating our trans neighbors' jobs, healthcare access, legal identities, and more.

But this is the annual Trans Day of **Visibility**, so let's be clear: the trans community is included and beloved in the Episcopal Church. Trans and nonbinary worshippers, children, and/or grandchildren have been connected to most of the local congregations I've served, including Trinity. The Episcopal Church has trans clergy; its Pride "shield" includes pale pink and blue stripes representing our trans members. We even have a liturgy for the blessing of a new name.

And so we pray for the trans and nonbinary worshippers among us as we pray for ourselves. We are called to care for them as we care for ourselves. And we rejoice in a God who loves each and every one of us—no exceptions!

This month, the vestry has chosen to put that money in Trinity's own Discretionary Fund. That's the fund we draw on when people come to the office looking for things like emergency housing, help with a utility bill, or a bus ticket out of town. There's a lot of need in the community and we always get more requests than we can meet. This fund is typically supported by a small line item in Trinity's budget and by individual donations. On March 30, therefore, any offerings put in the plate that aren't clearly part of a regular pledge payment will be put in the Discretionary Fund—with thanks for your generosity!

Feeding the 5,000 Families

The theme for this year's campaign is "Open the Door, All are Welcome" and the campaign runs March 15 through April 19. **The campaign begins with a kickoff concert featuring our own Alleluia Choir, along with others, on Saturday, March 15, 7:00 p.m. at Central Christian Church.**

Each Sunday in Lent we'll collect food for My Brothers' Table as part of the campaign. MBT especially needs items for visitors' takeaway bags: proteins (chili, tuna); vegetables (green beans, corn); and pasta (mac & cheese, ramen). Bring a box, a can or a case; bring them in one week or every week!

The campaign's formerly-progressive dinner, which raises funds for the Idaho Foodbank, will be held at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints Caldwell Park Building. It's on April 12 beginning at 5:30 p.m. See Rita for tickets!

On Saturday, April 19 (the day before Easter), Trinity will also be collecting food and money for the foodbank at neighborhood supermarkets. We will need teams of volunteers to staff two-hour shifts at different store entrances. Can you help? If so, please contact Rita—or Marky in the church office.
