

From Rev. Haydie

The year is turning now.

One of the loveliest Octobers I can remember has ended. The garden beds are empty. The blazing red and yellow leaves have curled and dropped. The geranium blossoms have darkened. Often, we're waking up to grey skies and skiffs of snow on our railings and rooftops.

It's no surprise that the feasts of All Hallows—All Saints and All Souls—come at this time of year. It's a time when we can't help remembering the fragility of all life: the shortness of our lives here and the eternity of the life beyond. It's also a time when we're reminded how inseparable those shorter and longer lives are. The yellowed leaves above ground and the seeds growing beneath them. Our grief for those we've lost, and our awareness of their spirits still beside us.

And so at All Saints we give thanks for all of those we've "loved but see no more"—all those who have loved and guided us, all those who keep us mindful of the larger life around us. Mindful of God's care for them, and for us.

But this edition of *The Call* is coming out late, so even the All Saints holiday has come and gone. The church year is almost over. We'll celebrate its last day on the Sunday before Thanksgiving, using a liturgy from the New Zealand Prayer Book. We'll give thanks for all creation and for everything we've been given. We'll bless the pledges from our stewardship drive. And then, on the following Sunday, the new church year will begin: we'll start making Advent wreaths and waiting for the birth of a baby in Bethlehem.


