The Refuge is located in the basement of the Congregational Church, just a block west of us. As the weather grows colder, it's struggling to provide warm space and warm meals for the men and women who need it most. Several members of our congregation have stepped up to help with the "meals" part, signing up to provide one or more nights' dinner for the 20-40 guests the Refuge expects on any given date. Of equal need, however, is financial support for building expenses and heat. So we hope you'll remember our homeless neighbors when the plate comes to you on the 29th!

# **PWCC** Update

Thank you, thank you, thank you to the Weavers of Trinity (formerly ECW) for their generous donation of \$250 for incentives for the Edify Program at the Pocatello Women's Correctional Center (PWCC). I recently received information about the program and would like to share it with you.

#### **Equality Defined by Integrity for a Future You (EDIFY)**

- Our MISSION is every definition is for you!
- Our VISION is that we are all a work in progress who want to redefine the culture of our community and ourselves to become our best version.
- EDIFY is a peer to peer program where residents are held to a high standard of proactivity making the culture in the facility better. The residents apply to be part of the program and need to be incident free and engaged in classes. There are three levels of participation based on merit and participation: volunteer, teacher, mentor. Activities include beginning with setting up and taking down for events to helping residents around them adjust to the new surroundings.

I've talked with several of the residents who are part of the program and they are very enthusiastic about it and also enjoy the incentives.

The PWCC Ministry thanks you for your continued support and prayers.

## From Rev. Haydie

It's been quite a month! Trinity had a glorious start to its November with two All Saints' celebrations. The Alleluia choir joined us for Eucharist in the morning, and a fully Choral Evensong service led by Trent Clegg closed out the evening. That evening service was quickly followed by another, as we ended Election Day with a lovely sung Compline service introduced to us by Joe Crupper.

Just days later, we welcomed the Episcopal Diocese of Idaho to Pocatello. Many thanks to all the helping hands who sorted folders, checked delegates in, and helped set up communion.

In the weeks that followed, participants in Trinity's reading group discussed Atul Gawande's *Being Mortal*, and participants in the "Loving the Questions" group explored ways of responding to the challenging images of God often associated with the Hebrew Scriptures. At least, that's where the conversation started...

Trinity congregants also attended—and helped organize—two interfaith services in November: the annual Transgender Day of Remembrance observation and the Portneuf Valley Interfaith Fellowship's Thanksgiving service. PVIF's Thanksgiving service was built around a theme of "Gratitude for Community," and that's a value to hold close in the months ahead.

I am endlessly grateful for this congregation's commitment to our own church community and to the larger community in which we live. I'll admit I hesitated to bring The Refuge's needs to Trinity, knowing how many other ways Trinity's congregants were already helping others. I hesitated—but others didn't. Before I said anything at all, other parishioners had jumped in to do what they could: they'd signed up for meals, written checks, started posting The Refuge's needs on Facebook, in the bulletin, and in the Weave. And of everything this congregation did in November, that readiness to help those in need may be what I'm most grateful for.
