From Rev. Haydie

The butterfly: a symbol of transformation and resurrection and hope. It's true that butterflies are more often associated with summer than fall, but when stewardship chair Susanne Forrest looked at this year's "Tell Out My Soul" stewardship logo, a butterfly is what she saw.

As we enter the Parish Hall, therefore, we're now greeted by a garland of brightly colored butterflies. No picture I've tried to take does them justice. Interspersed with happy caterpillars, they fly across the room like jewel-toned illustrations out of Eric Carle's *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*. Each butterfly represents progress towards Trinity's \$103,000 fundraising goal: pledges that will help us keep the lights on, pay staff, and maintain our historic building.

But it also represents more. These butterflies remind us that true flourishing requires transformation. We start out as caterpillars but we're not called to remain that way... even if we're happy caterpillars. Maybe **especially** if we're happy caterpillars! We've been listening to Jesus say so in our readings all fall. He's kept challenging his listeners to let go of the things that seem familiar, comfortable, even necessary. To take risks, and follow him into true fullness of life.

In November we typically celebrate the familiar, the abundant. We're surrounded by blessings that Carle's hungry caterpillar would have loved: potatoes and apples, pumpkin pies and green bean casseroles. We give thanks for family and church family and community. Our butterflies remind us, though, that our gratitude should be the beginning of our journey, not its end. Transformation. Resurrection. Hope. What better vision to hold on to as we look forward to a new church year?

Beyond Trinity's Doors

- This year's **Diocesan Convention Eucharist** will be on **Saturday, November 8, at 8:30 am** at the Shoshone-Bannock Hotel and Event Center. You're invited! This service will open the second day of our annual convention, and it's a great chance to worship with other Episcopalians.
- Portneuf Valley Interfaith Fellowship's annual **Thanksgiving Service** will take place at **6pm on Sunday, November 23**, at Pocatello's First United Methodist Church (200 N 15th Ave.) Many faith groups will be participating, and the offering will be divided between PVIF and the Senior Center.
- Our LDS neighbors' **Giving Machine** will be at the ICCU Headquarters in Chubbuck from November 15 to November 30. An alternative gift market in a big red vending machine, this project supports charities including Aid for Friends, SEICCA, and CARE. Visitors can "buy" a meal through Meals on Wheels... or essential baby items for a first time mom... or a year's tuition for a girl in Africa, among so many other things. They'll get an acknowledgement card for each item which they can give to someone on their holiday shopping list or keep for themselves. This is the first year the Giving Machine will be in East Idaho, and it will be available from 10 am to 9pm. 100% of donations go to the charities chosen.

Feeding God's Sheep

As of this writing, it looks like SNAP benefits will be unavailable for an indefinite amount of time beginning on November 1. This is a policy decision that affects our church community, our local community, and our nation.

If you have been relying on SNAP benefits
and you need grocery support in the coming weeks,
please let Rev. Haydie know.

Trinity has a fund which should be able to help.

Trinity's commitment to those in need is longstanding. It includes, of course, My Brother's Table, which has served a hot meal every Sunday for more than forty years. Guests at My Brother's Table can also leave with a bag containing canned food (a meat, a carbohydrate, a vegetable) for their evening meal. It includes Our Gathering Place, which provides not only a safe space but substantial after school snacks for students many of whom are food insecure. And it includes our discretionary fund, which provides (to the extent possible) basics like emergency housing and utility support to people both in our congregation and beyond it.

None of it is ever enough. And now, with the suspension of SNAP benefits, the closing of the Refuge warming shelter, and the coming of cold weather, the need is greater than ever. The timing is dreadful, of course. It's not just that this is a season when so many organizations—including Trinity!—are conducting fundraising campaigns of their own. It's also a time when many of us are seeing our own expenses rise. But every one of us can do something to help our neighbors in need, whether it's volunteering, donating money, or donating food. And we will, because that's what Jesus calls us to do.


