"Tell out, my soul, the greatness of the Lord." In singing this hymn we share Mary's joy at Jesus's coming into the world. Mary sings of the God who feeds the hungry and lifts the humble, the God whose justice and mercy are without end. She's an unmarried peasant girl in an occupied nation. She can't begin to imagine what her future or her son's will look like. But she trusts what God is doing,. She rejoices in being part of it. And we rejoice with her.

Autumn is, after all, a traditional time for celebrating our Blessings. Often those blessings are obvious: the rain is finally falling. The trees are turning red and gold. We're sharing harvest meals with our families and church families. Sometimes, however, we need to work a little harder to see God's blessings. We need to "look for the helpers," as Mr. Rogers told us. Often, we need to be those helpers, as Mary was. To do our parts to help God lift up the struggling and defend the weak. To remind each other of God's love, shining out as a beacon of hope.

And so "tell out my soul" is also the theme of this year's stewardship campaign. You should be receiving a stewardship mailing in a week or so, and we hope you'll read it prayerfully.



The vestry's budget goal for this campaign, \$103,000, hasn't risen over last year's, because we know that our world is facing very real financial pressures.

Trinity is facing the same challenges, of course. But we pray to follow Mary's example: to trust in God's goodness, and to rejoice that we, too, get to be part of building God's Kingdom.

Some of us already know Misty, who's been active in our diocese for quite a while. As an accountant, she also helped Trinity with our records a few years back. PWCC Update

Lots of good things happened at the Pocatello Women's Correction Center (PWCC) last month. First of all, 2,000 Black Compositions Books were anonymously donated last week! THANK YOU. This generous gift will allow each resident to receive a composition book every three months for the next year and a half. Currently the compositions books are only distributed when the donated number allows for each resident to receive one which has been sporadic. The composition books are used for class work, journal writing and letter writing etc. and are greatly treasured and appreciated by the residents. On September 30th we completed a most challenging 14 week course with four graduates. Bridges To Life is a faith based program that draws from the principles of restorative justice to provide a healing process to crime victims and prison offenders. This program was founded in Texas by John Sage in 1998 and currently has over 93,000 graduates with a recidivism rate of 11.1%, significantly lower than national norm range of 46% to 66% within three years of release. It is a truly amazing program. If you are interested in learning more about the program please
