## From Rev. Haydie

We're halfway through Lent, and we're well into the wilderness. Many of us are shaken by our deeply suffering world: by bombed schools and bombed cities, lost neighbors and lost servicemembers. We're faced with our own frailty. We wonder what to do... whether we can even do it... and what will happen next.

Lent often brings these questions, but it also reminds us that we're not alone. We're walking with Jesus, who entered fully into this world's pain. We're walking with each other. So as we approach Holy Week, we're going to focus on those connections: Christ and community. And I'd like to you about two services we're doing a little differently this year.

**Maundy Thursday Supper.** On Maundy Thursday, we'll remember that the first Eucharist was part of a supper among friends. We'll come together in the parish hall for a simple Mediterranean style meal at 6pm. We'll hear the bible's stories of other meals. We'll pray. And then—like Jesus and the disciples—we'll bless and share our bread and wine. After communion we'll move into the church itself for the stripping of the altar and the Gospel of the Watch.

**Interchurch Vigil.** On the night before Easter, we'll share our vigil with two other churches: Good Shepherd Lutheran and First Methodist. Together, we'll hear the Exsultet sung in our darkened church. We'll hear short reflections from different preachers on stories of God's saving acts across time. And we'll reaffirm the faith we've shared across churches and nations and centuries—the faith that hope breaks into even our darkest hours. I hope you'll join us!



Members of the Alleluia Choir joined Trinity for crafts and worship before Lent began!


