Every month I am reminded that next month looms, and it's time to write a new letter. I am convinced that each month is shorter than the last, but the calendar tells me that June was only one day shorter than May, and that July, in fact, is one day longer than June. So yes, "thirty days hath September' and so on, but thirty Warden days seems more like a week passing. A whole year? That's more like a couple of months.

My time-warp experience is common among humans, especially as we age. It makes sense, because every day of our lives is a smaller proportion of our lifespan than the preceding day. Remember as a kid when fifteen minutes seemed like an eternity, and compare how quickly in adulthood the years slide past.

In spite of our human perceptions of time, the clock moves at a measured pace. The clock reflects the daily spinning of our earth, the monthly orbit of the moon, and our annual orbit around the sun. We, and everybody and everything around us, are all moving on this same majestic timescale. God's great timescale. It doesn't speed up, and it doesn't slow down. In our own short visits to His great clockworks we perceive that time moves at different rates, but our perceptions fool us.

In fact, in taking the Sacraments, we join the body of believers who have preceded us, and those who will follow. We have a tiny taste of eternity, and we figuratively become part of the immortal body that is the Holy Trinity itself, the great maker and keeper of time.

Every second is precious, as is all time from Alpha to Omega. We are a part of eternity, but we're only given a short time to participate in it. Make the best of your share, for yourselves, for your communities, for your world, and above all, for God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Several Trinity grandchildren are traveling as well, spending time at Paradise Point church camp in McCall. From the photos, it looks like they're having a wonderful time!





Pocatello Women's Correctional Center (PWCC) Ministry Update

The last several months have been a busy time for Trinity's outreach ministry to PWCC. An Idaho Department of Correction training for volunteers was hosted by Trinity earlier last month in the Parish Hall with about thirty people in attendance from various faiths and community organizations. The three-hour presentation from 5 to 8 pm went by quickly and the healthy snacks were a hit.

Zoom and Microsoft Teams have allowed us to safely expand our services to the residents at PWCC. Eucharist Services, book study (Anne Lamott's <u>HELP, THANKS, WOW The Three Essential Prayers)</u>, Courage for Life discipleship program and one on one clergy counseling are all being offered on various days via technology. The Story Link Program requires in-person presence at PWCC due to the audio recording and soon to be visual recording of the residents reading to their children.

A proposal for a grant to the Idaho Episcopal Foundation is also underway for a need at PWCC, but more about that next month.

Last but not least, thank you to all for the donations of greeting cards, black composition books and basic chap-sticks. This is an on-going need at PWCC and is greatly appreciated.


