From Rev. Haydie

Welcome to bread month, y'all.

All our Gospel readings in August come from the sixth chapter of John's gospel. "I am the bread of life," Jesus will tell us... over and over again. He'll tell us about who he is; he'll tell us about what being fed really means. He's going to challenge how **we** think about him, and how we think about being fed. And facing that challenge won't always be easy.

Indeed, when our month begins—right after the feeding of the 5,000—Jesus's popularity is at a high. The crowds are pursuing him: they want more bread, more healing, more security. By the end of the month, however, most of these seekers have slipped away. Those things aren't what Jesus is ultimately offering, they've discovered. What he IS offering sounds a little... weird.



What Jesus is offering is nothing less than himself. A deep, unbreakable connection with him, with God, with the divine, both in this life and in the larger life all around us.

That connection sustains us, as bread does. It's always open to us and to everyone around us. But it's demanding. "Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice," we often pray before communion. Jesus's words this month will remind us that entering his love doesn't mean escaping this world's brokenness and pain; it means sharing it.

Knowing Jesus is worth it, Peter will say. And seeking Jesus is why we come to God's table in every generation. Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the bread..

Back-to-School Blessings

It's almost time. Maybe for *some* of us August is high summer, a month to travel and read and relax, but for students it's time to put together new school supplies and school clothes. For teachers, it's time to decorate classrooms or build class syllabi. Classes will begin for both School District 25 and ISU in less than three weeks, so on **Sunday**, **August 18**, Fr. Don will do a back-to-school blessing at the end of our service. Bring your backpack... your laptop... your lunchbox... or just yourself! Let's start the schoolyear with gratitude for all the opportunities we've been given, as well as a reminder that God is with us throughout all our challenges.

Whether you've been Episcopalian for decades or have just started visiting Trinity recently, this fall offers several opportunities for deepening your connection with our tradition. Some of those opportunities are formal and liturgical; others, educational.

Liturgically, this fall offers an opportunity for new members to formally join the church and for current members to reaffirm their baptismal vows. Any of these things can happen during our Sunday morning service on October 13, when we'll enjoy our annual visit from Bishop Jos Tharakan.

Maybe you'd like to be baptized...or confirmed... or welcomed into the Episcopal Church from another tradition? Or maybe your sense of God and what it means to live as a Christian have changed, and you're ready to formally renew a commitment you made years ago? If so, come talk to Rev. Haydie and we'll work out a preparation process that makes sense for you... maybe one that includes the class below.

Educationally, we'll offer a series of Saturday morning classes focused on Episcopal faith and practice. Called "Loving the Questions," these classes will take place on the fourth Saturday of each month, beginning in August; see the article on the next page for more details. Class meetings will include teaching, discussion, and coffee, and each should take 60-90 minutes. Come to one, or come to all!

Loving the Questions

What do we talk about when we talk about Eucharist? Or salvation? What do we believe about the Bible, or about Jesus? What does God expect from us? How do we know?

Some of us learned "answers" to these questions in confirmation classes, as teenagers. But not all those answers were exactly the same, even for those confirmed in the Episcopal tradition. Not all those questions mattered to us at the time, and not all those answers still work for us now.

So here's a chance to revisit some of those questions and to learn more about the traditions that speak to them. This fall, beginning at **10:00am on Saturday, August 24**, Trinity will be holding a monthly series of Adult Education classes. Welcoming new and long-time parishioners alike, these classes will explore aspects of Episcopal faith and practice.



We'll look at the perspectives reflected in our Eucharistic Prayers and explore what those prayers might mean to us. Then we'll choose questions to focus on in the following month. Trinity Reads


