

From Rev. Haydie

It's almost here. We'll share our last blast of Mardi Gras festivity (butter! sugar! games!) on Tuesday, February 13. On the next evening we'll come back for our Ash Wednesday Eucharist... and Lent will have begun.

Set in the often dark and dismal cold of late winter, Lent is "a season of penitence and fasting," our prayerbook says. It prepares us for new life at Easter, and it encourages us to take stock of our lives and our choices. What are we doing, it asks us, that may be pushing us away from God and God's hopes for us? Could we do less of it? What are we doing that brings us closer to God and God's hopes? Could we do more of it?

And yes: Lent has traditionally been a season of **going without**. It still is, for many people. As individuals we might give up sugar, or coffee, or Facebook. As a church we might give up flowers on its altar, or music for its psalms. "Going without" is about asking ourselves what we truly need. It's about reminding ourselves that whatever it is, we already have it... and that we can thank God for it.

But Lent is also a season of **going within**... indeed, of **growing within**. It's the season when deep-buried seeds stretch out their first small tendrils into the earth. A season when we encourage our hearts to practice reaching for God even in dark and desolate places. A season for our faith to grow.

To that end, our Lenten series this year will focus on Barbara Brown Taylor's book *Learning to Walk in the Dark*. I hope you'll join us on Thursday nights; I hope you'll consider reading along with us, if you can't. And I pray that yours may be a blessed and holy Lent.




