I pray that, as a nation, now and in the future, we find favor in our attempts to be our best Christian selves.

We discussed making bags of needed items for the needy who are discharged from the hospital and the ladies in the halfway house who have been released from PWCC. There will be no ECW meeting in July. Our next meeting will be a pot luck on August 20th at 11:00 in the Parish Hall. Please start collecting school supplies during the back-to-school sales. At our meeting we will fill bags with a few age appropriate supplies, so every student has something to be blessed. Supplies for all levels of learning will be needed (elementary, middle school, high school and college). Blessing of the backpacks during the service on August 21st will be followed by an ice cream social to get the school year off to a good start.


All women of the church, ages 16 and up are members of ECW and welcome to attend.

Raised an Evangelical Christian, Held Evans had moved into the Episcopal Church and

gained national attention as a faith leader when she died in 2019-suddenly and too soon-at the age of 37.



month. Our prayers go with them. We're looking forward to their first visitation to Trinity, whenever that turns out to be!








