From Rev. Haydie

Summer is almost here! The lilacs are in bloom... our graduates have been celebrated (thanks, Kathleen Kangas and Miffy Lane, for that great Trinity Sunday party)... and it's almost safe to assume that we can finally plant tomatoes outside.

In church, we're moving back into "ordinary time." Since December, we've remembered Jesus's birth, ministry, death, resurrection, and assumption; we've remembered the Spirit's whirling around the disciples in that Jerusalem room. From now through November, we're in "the long green season." In this season after Pentecost it's time for us, the church, to focus on how—guided by the Spirit—we can do God's work in the world.

That discernment happens in many places, at many levels. In our homes, it happens in our hearts and around our dinner tables. In our congregation, it happens in vestry meetings, as we bring together the thoughts and conversations we've had over the previous month. In our diocese, it happens in the work of Bishop and Council. And in the Episcopal Church, it happens at General Convention.

For an explanation of what the convention is and does, see the "Who's in Charge in the Church" article later in this issue. For now, though, let me note that the 81st General Convention is meeting in Louisville, Kentucky, at the end of this month. And it has a special task this year: electing a new Presiding Bishop to succeed the Rt. Rev. Michael Curry. He's a hard act to follow!

Our prayers are with our bishops and delegates this month as they—and all of us—work to live out the church's mission: "to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ."

Who's in Charge in the Church?

The Episcopal Church is governed by a church-wide convention that (normally) meets once every three years. It's this convention that has the power to change church laws and approve new liturgies; to shape our relationships with other churches in our communities and other Anglican churches across the world; to set budgets for the upcoming years; and to make policy on issues ranging from creation care to international conflict.

Who adopted our current prayer book? Who decided it was OK to ordain women? Who is responsible for addressing issues or racism and inequality that continue to challenge the church? It's General Convention, every time. The convention also elects the Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, who serves a 9-year term.

Like the U.S. Congress, convention participants are divided into two groups: the House of Bishops and the House of Deputies. The House of Bishops is made up of all the church's active bishops; the House of Deputies is made up of elected clergy and lay representatives from each diocese. Idaho's eight delegates were elected at our diocesan convention almost two years ago. Many or all of them have been working on convention-related committees every since, preparing for the work of this year's gathering.
