# From Rev. Haydie

Welcome to Lent: the season of forgiveness.

We don't usually talk about it that way, I know. We often associate Lent with **penitence**: our Ash Wednesday service describes it as a season of "self-examination and repentance." And those are important things.

But they're only a beginning. Because the point of Lent isn't to make us feel bad about things we can't undo, or are... perhaps... already struggling to undo. The point of Lent is to bring us closer to God, and that means opening ourselves to God's grace. It means recognizing that we **need** God's forgiveness, but it also means recognizing that we **have** God's forgiveness.

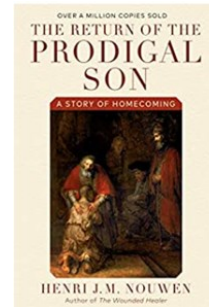
Jesus makes this point most powerfully in his parable of the prodigal son, which we'll hear as our gospel reading a few weeks from now.

But Jesus is also clear that forgiveness is a two-way street. "Forgive us our sins," he taught us to pray, "as we forgive those who sin against us." Our experience of forgiveness can't be divided from our ability to forgive ourselves. To forgive the people we've loved. To forgive the people we dislike, or those who offend us, or those who want to hurt us. Even, sometimes, to forgive God.

Only... we're not always that good at forgiveness. At least I'm not, and I don't think I'm alone. So I'm going to be working on forgiveness this season, and I invite you to join me. I'm going to start by reading a book I've never read by an author I've loved: Henry Nouwen's *The Return of the Prodigal Son*. If you've read it, or would like to read it and talk about it, let me know!

And may yours be a blessed, forgiving, and holy Lent.

Again this year we are inviting you to participate in an informative and enjoyable activity called “Lent Madness.” We’ve had fun with this in the past so we invite all of you to check it out and join us in this years’ “brackets.” Before you decide, we would like to quote

the following by way of explaining just what this free activity involves. From their website [www.lentmadness.org/wp](http://www.lentmadness.org/wp) “With its unique blend of competition, learning, and humor, Lent Madness allows participants to be inspired by the ways in which God has worked through the lives of saintly souls across generations and cultures. Throughout Lent, thirty-two saints will do battle to win the coveted Golden Halo.”

Based loosely on the NCAA basketball tournament of a similar name, this online devotion pits saints against one another in a bracket as voters choose their favorites throughout the penitential season.

Here’s how to participate: beginning Thursday March 3rd, on the weekdays of Lent, information is posted at [www.lentmadness.org](http://www.lentmadness.org) about two different saints. Each pairing remains open for 24 hours as participants read about and then vote to determine which saint moves on to the next round. Sixteen saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; eight advance to the round of the Elate Eight; four make to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the coveted Golden Halo.

The first round consists of basic biographical information about each of the 32 saints. Things get a bit more interesting in the subsequent rounds as we offer quotes and quirks, explore legends, and even move into the area of saintly kitsch.

This year Lent Madness features an intriguing slate of saints ancient and modern, Biblical and ecclesiastical.

The stories of all of these saintly people truly sheds light on what it means to be a follower of Christ. We hope you will join us this year and share in learning about “the lives of saintly souls across generations and cultures.”

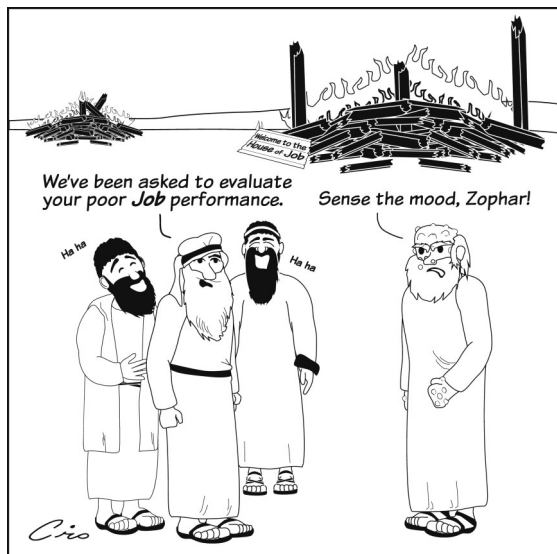
