Happy October!

If you've already checked out the "calendar" page of this newsletter you may have noticed that this month is a bit unusual. It has five Sundays, for one thing, and we'll be celebrating Eucharist on **four** of those five Sundays! (The exception is October 2, "World Communion Day." Ah, irony.) I love Morning Prayer. I'm grateful every day for the gifted worship leaders who lead it at Trinity. But it's a great blessing to be together at the Lord's Table.

I do miss kneeling at the altar rail... breaking the home-made bread... sharing the chalice. The common cup is an important part of our tradition, and we did not set it aside lightly at the beginning of the pandemic. At this time, we're still using individual cups for communion and wafers instead of bread. For logistical reasons, we're still offering communion from a central station in front of the altar steps. It won't be forever, though. Our Worship Committee has begun talking about when and how we can return to some of our pre-Covid customs, and I'd be interested to hear any thoughts you may have.

My own schedule will switch around a little this month: I'll be at Trinity on the fifth Sunday, rather than the fourth. I'll miss being here for Bishop Jos's visit (and for confirmation!) but I'm grateful for the chance to spend that morning with our friends at Fort Hall. We'll come to God's table with joy, wherever we are.

You can bring blankets from now through December 19th to church on Sunday, the church office during office hours, or call Kristen Johnson (208-237-2515) for pick up.

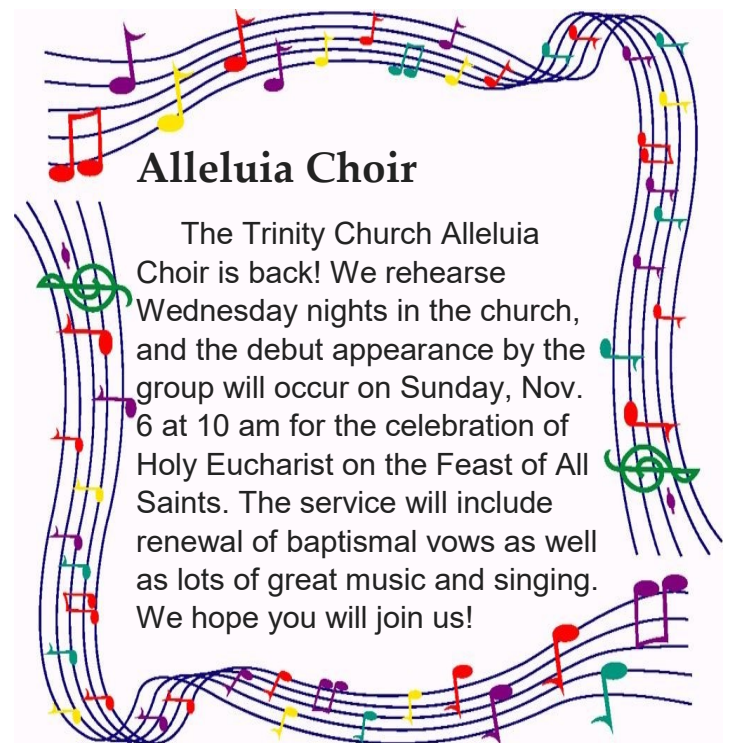

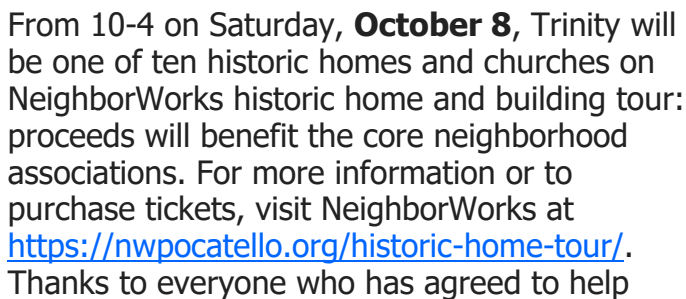
