From Rev. Haydie

He is risen!

He is risen indeed. It didn't make a lot of sense to the disciples on the road to Emmaus. It didn't seem *possible* to Thomas. It hardly seems possible to us. And it may seem even less possible if we turn on the television or open a newspaper. Death is conquered? Really?

We look at Gaza and Teheran and Tel Aviv and Ukraine and "we are faced," as the Dutch priest Henri Nouwen wrote, "with the temptation to believe that, after all, death is victorious." Like the women on their way to the tomb on Easter morning, we may feel overwhelmed by sadness and loss.

Our Easter stories, however, remind us that more possibilities exist than we can begin to imagine. They remind us that God is still with us, still sending us out in astonishment and hope.

"Go and tell," the angel said to the women. "Go and tell," Jesus repeated. The women's Easter morning encounter with Jesus wasn't about reunion or comfort, although I'm sure they experienced both. It was about living into a sense of possibility instead of staying mired in grief and paralysis and fear. It was about getting ready to remake their lives and their communities and their world just as God was already remaking the world.

And it asks us: Where in **our** lives do we find ourselves stuck in grief and paralysis and fear? How do we turn ourselves—how do we let Jesus turn us—towards joy? What risks do we take? What good news do we bear? What new world can we help make possible?

Feeding the 5,000 Families

Something else to celebrate: Trinity collected **1088** items for My Brother's Table during our Lenten Food Drive! As requested, these items were for visitors' takeaway bags: proteins (240 cans of chili and 144 of tuna); vegetables (272 cans), and pasta (384 packages of mac & cheese and ramen), and more. These are year-round needs, but we're now blessedly restocked for the summer months. Thank you all.

Meanwhile, Portneuf Valley's annual "Feeding the 5,000 Families" campaign continues. The dates originally published were reversed, but the grocery store food collection will be at Ridley's on April 11 and **the Progressive Dinner will be on Saturday, April 25**. Can we fill a table or two, as we did last year?

The evening will start at 5:30 pm with appetizers at the First United Methodist Church. It'll move on to a turkey dinner (vegetarian options available) at the Caldwell Park building of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and end with dessert at Central Christian Church. Tickets are \$15.00; see Rita Haggardt or get yours at the door! All proceeds go to the Idaho Foodbank and stay in Southeast Idaho.

New Bench! New Doors!

Trinity's new front doors are almost here, thanks to the hard work of Family Craft Construction and Richard Creason as well as a generous grant from Idaho Heritage Trust. Installers briefly hung the new, unfinished doors this week before taking them back to the shop to adjust and stain. We're looking forward to seeing them permanently installed soon.

Meanwhile, a beautification program sponsored by Historic Downtown Pocatello has brought a new bench to our corner, along with a matching garbage enclosure. Created by Kelshaw Custom Metals, both objects reflect the architecture of our landmarked building. Six of twenty benches have been completed so far... look for the others as you walk around Old Town this summer!

Trinity is also grateful to the City of Pocatello... we imagine?... for the concrete crew that magically showed up to grind down uneven surfaces in the Lander Street sidewalks last week. We weren't expecting them, but their work has made those sidewalks much safer for PHS students and all pedestrians.

In this session, we will discuss palliative care, hospice, the differences between the two, and medical decision-making, along with logistics for updating and filing paperwork, such as advance directives.

- **Tuesday, April 28 - *The Legacy of Peace***

In our final session, we will discuss funeral arrangements and logistics to ease your family's burden.
