### From Rev. Haydie

I didn't do my share, and I'm the first to admit it. When my parents passed one after the other, it was my sister, not I, who was left to cope with the logistics. She lived in a neighboring community; I lived 2,000 miles away. So it was Viv who cared for each of them in their last months; she who arranged for hospice, worked with the funeral home and the lawyer, closed the accounts, emptied and sold the home. So much work. So much time. I will **never** be able to thank her enough.

But now, like so many of us, Anne and I face our own profusion of wills, living wills, and POST forms. Of making funeral and burial arrangements that work for us **and** our largely nonreligious family. Of protecting, as best we can, the people and institutions we've loved. Of recording account numbers and **passwords**, *forheavenssake*, so that whoever comes after us can close the podcast subscriptions... the social media accounts... the WiFi for the cabin...

So I'm immensely grateful to the Idaho Episcopal Foundation for helping Trinity host **Leaving Gracefully**, a workshop exploring just such concerns. Held on **Saturday**, **May 17**, **from 10 am to 2:30 pm**, it will address funeral options, healthcare directives, wills, planned giving, and important personal records. Speakers will include Tony Budge, an attorney; Miranda Hedges, a Licensed Social Worker; and the Rev. Nancy Koonce, an accountant. I'll present briefly about the religious parts of this planning. Each person present will receive a booklet to track their decisions, helping them make choices that align with their values and wishes. And lunch is provided! ### Offerings Sent to Middle East

Early Palm Sunday morning, Presiding Bishop Sean Rowe learned that bombs had destroyed several parts of the last fully functional hospital in Gaza City. al-Ahli Hospital is a ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem, and Bishop Rowe immediately asked us to pray for the hospital's staff and patients; to give generously to the church's Good Friday offering; and to ask our representatives to support a ceasefire and humanitarian aid.

It is indeed traditional for each congregation's Good Friday offering to support the ministries of the Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East. But there is no offertory in the Good Friday service—just a plate at the back of the church—so the amount collected is usually small. In light of the bombings, therefore, Trinity's vestry agreed to send **both** its Thursday and Friday offerings to those ministries. Generous worshippers Raised a total of \$487, which we've now sent off. Please keep the people of Gaza in your prayers!

### Episcopal Church Weavers (ECW)

Episcopal Church Weavers (ECW) met for a work day on Saturday, April 19. Thanks to all who helped with our activities. We made Easter baskets for the seven children who attended the Easter Sunday church service. The baskets were delightful and very well received by the children.

Our big project was outdoor clean-up and beautification of the church grounds. A big thank you to Angela Young who began cleaning up a couple of weeks ahead of the meeting. Her work made our job much easier. We planted red spikes and pansies only due to the unseasonably cold weather that week. Our efforts made the church grounds look lovely for Easter Sunday. We will have another planting day in May when we are fairly sure the freezing nights are over and the sprinklers are turned on. The date has not yet been set but could change our expected ECW date for May.

The next meeting of ECW is currently planned for May 24 at 11:00 in the parish hall. This is a week later than usual due to the Leaving Gracefully workshop on the 17th. All are welcome! There are no meetings planned for June, July or August so we can enjoy a duty-free summer.

### **PWCC** Update

The purchase and delivery of fifty *Message* Bibles for the residents of PWCC was completed last month, along with lining up an appointment for the tuning of two pianos at the facility. This project was made possible by the generous donation from Trinity's Weavers (ECW). Thank so much for your continued support of this ministry. Our Easter Service was well attended and greatly appreciated. The Easter Lily we brought up was also admired and was left in the lobby for visitors to see. The Story Link program continues on the second and fourth Fridays of the month. We will also present a book study of *Good Goats* in April.


