From Rev. Haydie

"My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so."

I've loved this prayer by Thomas Merton for many years, but its opening words have never seemed truer to me than they do right now. Like so many of us, I don't know where we're going... nor am I at all sure how to respond to this historical moment.

But here's what I do know: We are made in the image of God, every one of us. We are called to look for God in one another. We are called to love and serve God in one another. And "we are called," writes Idaho's Bishop Jos Tharakan, "to be a beacon of light. As followers of Christ, we are reminded of the biblical command to welcome the stranger and care for the most vulnerable among us, keeping aside political affiliations and affinities."

The light is Christ's, not our own. Remembering that Jesus spent much of his ministry challenging boundaries between "us" and "them," we are called to lift those beacons—our own little, flickering flames—high enough for their light to spill across all the barriers that separate us. High enough to recognize Jesus's love for the people we disagree with, the people we're afraid of, the people we may sometimes forget or dismiss or despise. High enough to help us glimpse the next right steps we can take.

Maybe the smallness of our flames is its own blessing. Maybe it reminds us how much we need **all** our lights to live out God's dream of justice and mercy. And maybe the shadows around them are our reminder to "walk humbly" in Jesus's footsteps. May we always follow him in loving those who need us most.
