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Honourable André M. Ebanks

Premier and Minister for Financial Services & Commerce

Honourable André Ebanks was sworn-in as Premier of the Cayman Islands in May 2025 following his election as a second term Member of Parliament for West Bay South in the April 2025 general election. Passionate about strengthening the Caymanian community, Premier Ebanks, who is the leader of The Caymanian Community Party (TCCP), entered politics to create meaningful change and advance the needs of Caymanians.

Prior to becoming a Member of Parliament, Premier Ebanks had a distinguished career both in government and the private sector. He is an attorney-at-law who has practised for more than a decade at two of the largest law firms in the Cayman Islands. He was called to the Bar of England and Wales in 2005 and to the Cayman Islands Bar in 2006.

The Premier holds a Bachelor of Laws from the University of Liverpool, a degree in sociology from Morgan State University and a Masters in Legal Practice from Manchester Metropolitan University. Among his professional and civic activities is his membership to the Honourable Society of the Middle Temple, England.



Honourable Rolston Anglin

Minister for Finance & Economic Development and Minister for Education & Training

Honourable Rolston Anglin attended Sir John A. Cumber Primary School, and graduated from the Cayman Islands High School. He received an academic scholarship from major international accounting firm, Price Waterhouse (now PricewaterhouseCoopers), to attend university, graduating with honours from Ohio State University. While there, Mr. Anglin was a member of the Phi Kappa Phi Honour Society and the Golden Key Honour Society.

In April 2000, Mr. Anglin left a very lucrative professional career to represent his people. He was first elected in November 2000. Mr. Anglin served three terms (2000-2013) as a Member of the Legislative Assembly. During the 2009-2013 term, he was appointed the Minister of Education. Mr. Anglin was re-elected to Parliament after a twelve-year absence and is a member of the governing National Coalition for Caymanians.



Honourable Isaac Rankine

Minister for Social Development & Innovation and Minister for Youth, Sports, Culture & Heritage

Honourable Isaac Douglas Rankine, in his second term as the elected Member of Parliament for the constituency of East End, was sworn in on 6 May 2025 as Minister for Youth, Sports, Culture & Heritage and Minister for Social Development & Innovation, in the Cayman Islands. In addition, he is a member of the Parliamentary Management Commission Council.

Mr. Rankine recognises the importance of policies that preserve our heritage, ensure that the youngest to the most senior persons in our community are supported and served, and that social strategies are developed to meet the needs of our community. His vision for a country that represents the Caymanian values of our forefathers - built to thrive in a robust global environment - is embedded in his efforts to serve the Cayman Islands.



Dr. Temple Grandin

Professor of Animal Science, Colorado State University

Dr. Temple Grandin is a professor of animal science at Colorado State University. When she was two and a half years old, she had no speech and all the symptoms of severe autism. Early intensive speech therapy enabled her to speak by age four. Her mother always encouraged her interest in art and urged her to draw many different things. Good teachers and mentors were essential for Temple's success.

Her high school science teacher challenged her with interesting projects where she had to figure out how to make things work. When studying in school became a pathway to becoming a scientist, she was motivated to study.

An HBO movie titled Temple Grandin was made about her life and Temple was inducted into The National Women's Hall of Fame and The Academy of Arts and Sciences. Facilities she has designed handle over half the cattle in the U.S. Some of her most important books are New York Times bestseller *Animals in Translation*, *Thinking in Pictures*, *The Autistic Brain* and *The Way I See It*.



Denis Olarou

Director and Legal Counsel, Autism Cayman

Denis is a partner in Carey Olsen's dispute resolution, litigation and insolvency practice, advising on Cayman Islands and British Virgin Islands law. He has extensive experience acting on complex, high-value and multi-jurisdictional matters, including insolvency and restructuring, fraud and asset recovery, shareholder disputes and international arbitration.

As the father of a 12-year-old autistic daughter, he has developed a deeply personal understanding of both the challenges and the opportunities that exist within the community. Denis is particularly passionate about encouraging the development of policies and practical initiatives that improve access to education, healthcare and community support for autistic children and adults. Through his involvement in this symposium and related efforts, he hopes to contribute to a more inclusive Cayman community - one where neurodiverse individuals are better understood, supported and empowered to thrive.



Desirée Powery-Tatum

President and Treasurer, Autism Cayman

Desirée Powery-Tatum is Caymanian and a proud educator in the private and public schools for over 12 years. Her 13 year old son is autistic and non-speaking. He inspires her daily to advocate for the rights of those who face challenges because of their neurodiversity. She is passionate about inclusion and believes that all people have a right to the same quality of education, opportunities and services. She hopes to bring awareness and to see positive changes to the Cayman community, where policies and practical changes are put into place for the benefit of autistic children and adults.

Desirée received an associates degree in social studies at the University College of the Cayman Islands (UCCI). This enabled her to move to the United States where she earned her Bachelor's of Business Administration in Finance degree at Florida International University. After returning to Grand Cayman, Desirée worked in the financial services industry for several years before deciding to change career paths to earn a Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) from the University of Sunderland (UK).

She holds a Bachelor of Science in Health and Medical Sciences from the University of Warwick and a Master of Science in Occupational Therapy from the University of Essex, where her research explored the role of occupational therapy in paralympic sport participation and performance.

Arianna is registered with the UK Health and Care Professions Council and Cayman Islands Council for Professions Allied with Medicine, and has clinical experience across paediatric, geriatric, community and acute care settings. Her work has included supporting children with autism spectrum disorder, sensory processing differences and attention difficulties, as well as contributing to emotion regulation, fatigue management and sensory-friendly educational environments.



Sloane Pharr-Strang

Sloane Pharr-Strang is the developmental support services manager at The Wellness Centre. She has worked in the field of ABA supporting autistic individuals and their families for 20 years. She is also a Cabinet-appointed member of the National Council for Persons with Disabilities.

An experienced nonprofit leader and operations specialist, Ally Olarou currently serves as director and secretary of Autism Cayman. Shannon Seymour

Director, The Wellness Centre

Dr. Shannon Seymour, PhD, is a licensed psychologist with over 25 years of experience specialising in neurodevelopmental disorders such as autism spectrum disorder (ASD), ADHD, and learning disorders, as well as related conditions like anxiety, OCD, and ARFID. She holds a PhD in psychology and master's degrees in clinical psychology and developmental disabilities.

In 2010, Dr. Seymour helped establish the Cayman Islands' first autism diagnostic panel, improving access to local services. Her clinic, The Wellness Centre, introduced ABA therapy locally and was among the first trained in the Early Start Denver Model (ESDM). Today, the centre offers a range of supports, including The Butterfly Connection, a free community space for girls and young women. Dr. Seymour is the Director of The Wellness Centre and President of the Cayman Islands Psychological Association.



Janelle Tibbetts

Founder and Director, Spark! School of Performing Arts

Janelle Tibbetts is the founder and director of Spark! School of Performing Arts, where she combines her passion for the arts with over 15 years of experience as a music educator and performing arts leader. She is dedicated to creating high-quality performing arts learning environments that balance excellence, inclusion and meaningful engagement, supporting individuals to develop confidence, creativity and a strong connection to the arts.

She holds a Bachelor of Music in Music Education (summa cum laude) from Florida International University and a Master of Science in Education specialising in curriculum, instruction and assessment from Walden University. Janelle leads innovative performing arts programmes with a focus on music education, and works with educators to support high-quality, inclusive practice. Lana's advocacy journey began with her daughter, Kinsley, who was diagnosed with autism in 2016 at the age of three. This personal experience ignited a deep passion for supporting individuals on the autism spectrum and their families within the community. Committed to making a meaningful impact, Lana focuses on raising awareness of autism across the Cayman Islands while promoting understanding, acceptance and inclusion. She is especially passionate about creating supportive spaces that provide learning opportunities, foster independence and open pathways to meaningful employment for both children and adults on the spectrum.



Laura Kelly

Speech and Language Therapist, Cayman Islands Health Services Authority

Laura Kelly is a dynamic, neurodiversity-affirming paediatric speech and language therapist with the Health Services Authority (HSA) who has called the Cayman Islands home for the past eight years. Her passion for our community extends to her role as vice president of the Cayman Islands Early Childhood Association and being the first certified perinatal practitioner in the Cayman Islands. She is an advocate for infant and maternal mental health and believes that communication and connection begin in the womb. Laura has launched Babble Boot Camp, a proactive approach for at risk infants. She knows that supporting babies before they show signs of delay is crucial in decreasing the number of children requiring support in the future.

Graduating with a master's degree in speech-language pathology from the University of Buffalo at New York, Laura has over 24 years of clinical expertise with communication disorders. She strives to ensure each patient's voice is heard no matter how they communicate. Laura prides herself on making connections while working collaboratively with families and the community. She believes we are stronger together.



Phillippa Miller

Phillippa Miller is a special educational needs coordinator (SENCO) with 20 years of experience across education and the charity sector, supporting children and young people with diverse disabilities. In Cayman for almost a decade, she has worked at the Lighthouse School as the vocational teacher and at CIFEC as a SENCO and school inclusion specialist.

She holds a postgraduate advanced diploma in arts psychotherapy, is a mental health first aider, and a trained senior lead for mental health in schools. As both an educator and the parent of a neurodivergent child, Phillipa brings a dual perspective that informs her advocacy for compassionate, inclusive person-centred support.

Registered Speech Therapist, Lead - Allied Health, Student Support Services, Department of Education Services

Louise Pennington is a specialist speech and language therapist with over 30 years' experience supporting autistic individuals across education, health and social care. She is the Allied Health Team Lead for the Department of Education, overseeing speech and language therapy and occupational therapy services in schools and early years settings.

Louise advocates for neuro-affirming practice, focusing on communication, sensory regulation and social-emotional wellbeing to support inclusive learning. She has led whole-school autism-informed initiatives, including work with the Elizabeth Newson Centre, and contributed to evidence-based approaches endorsed by the Autism Education Trust (UK). Her work includes advocating for autistic women and girls, advising on sensory considerations and supporting the publication "Is That Clear? Effective Communication in a Neurodiverse World." She is committed to person-centred, needs-led practice, learning from neurodivergent perspectives to drive inclusive, system-level change in education and healthcare.
