Introduction:

The questions are meant to be straight forward taking answers from exactly the way the passage in your King James Bible is worded.

Finally, keep in mind what the apostle Paul writes concerning his writings:

2Timothy 2:7, 15 Consider what I say; and the Lord give thee understanding in all things...Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

Ephesians 3:4 Whereby, when ye <u>read</u>, ye may <u>understand</u> my <u>knowledge</u> in the <u>mystery of Christ</u>)
