

Topic: The Old Man vs the New Man



Study:


1. The “old man”:

- a. What do we know has happened to the “old”? Romans 6:6
- b. What is the believer to do with the “old”? Ephesians 4:22
- c. What are the “deeds” of the “old”? Colossians 3:8-9



2. The “new man”:

- a. What “new” is formed in the believer? 2Corinthians 5:17
- b. Of what is the “created in Christ” capable? Ephesians 2:10
- c. How is the “new” described? Ephesians 4:24
- d. How is the “new” sustained? Colossians 3:10-17



3. Characteristics of the old, and the new:

Colossians 3:9-11 Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds; And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him: Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircumcision, Barbarian, Scythian, bond *nor* free: but Christ *is* all, and in all.
