To the saints at First Presbyterian:

Greetings. Ever wondered where we got our worship style and our order of worship? Reformed worship was inspired by Isaiah 6 where Isaiah had his vision of being taken up into heaven and placed in the presence of God. The order in which he experienced that event is where we get our order for worship, begin by glorifying God, then in God's presence, confessing our sins, then being forgiven and then responding to God's call, whom shall I send.

While following this order of responding, almost all protestant worship follows the Roman mass. Parts of the mass are adopted and either redone or rejected. Worship and theology evolve as world events determine its different aspects. Our book of Confessions was written over many years of societal development and situations. Like the Bible which was put together depending if you were Catholic or Protestant. Even the 10 commandments are different. These states that want to put them in classrooms will need to decide if they will be Catholic, {protestant or even Jewish versions. It would be better just to live the commandments rather than putting them on walls I think.

To illustrate theological development of different churches, I want to list the development of the Roman church as it evolved. Both Protestant and Catholic churches went through evolution to its present state. You might find this development interesting.

In 431, the cult of the Virgin was developed.

In 594, Purgatory was invented.

In 610, the title of Pope was invented.

In 955, the meaning of kadosh (set aside0was changed to saint.

In 1079, celibacy of priests is imposed. A totally Catholic word.

In 1090, the Rosary was imposed.

In 1184, the Inquisition was perpetuated.

In 1190, indulgences were sold.

In 1215 confessions were imposed on priests.

In 1216 Pope Innocence III's ill tale of terror of bread, (a god in Greek mythology) which turns to human flesh, was invented.

In 1439, the non-existent Purgatory was dogmatized.

In 1854, the immaculate conception was invented.

In 1870, the infallibility of the pope was established.

Very interesting at how all these things were developed. All for good reasons I guess.

The Presbyterian motto from the Reformation is "once reformed, always reforming." We remain a "work in progress." That's what it means to be led by the Spirit of God. Change will always be part of our church evolution. We may not like it or even understand it but we trust it's of God's doing. We will never be bored, after all, the church is the Bride of Christ!
