To the Saints of First Presbyterian,

Greetings, my partner in ministry is pastor of First Presbyterian in Lufkin. He has written a good article on worship and patriotism. I thought it would be good to print the whole article. So, here is his letter:

I have been asked why we keep our worship separate from our patriotism. It is a complicated and nuanced issue and a very good question. As the son of a career military officer that flew the American flag ever day, patriotism is a big part of who I am. Likewise, as a Presbyterian pastor, the son of a Presbyterian elder, and the grandson of a Clerk of Session, keeping the church free of political influences that interfere with Christian doctrine is also critically important to me.

Briefly, let's talk about separation of church and state. This constitutional doctrine is very much misunderstood and boils down to the tension between two constitutional clauses known as the "free exercise" clause and the "non-establishment clause." Both are limits on what the government can do, not the free exercise of religion (that includes all religions, not just Christianity.) The government is also prohibited from establishing a national religion (again that includes Christianity and all other religions). To illustrate the tension, the government cannot tell students not to pray before a test in school (free exercise). On the other hand, a government employee (such as a teacher) cannot require students to pray (non-establishment).

So, you can see that what we do in church is not really a matter of separation of church and state except to the extent the government cannot tell us how to worship. However, we should not let our personal patriotism affect our dedication to the Word of God. God created the whole world and instructs us to love contrary to scripture. This is when patriotism becomes nationalism. Patriotism is love of country. Nationalism is the hate of others, or fear of others who are perceived as a threat to our country. There is no room for hate in Christianity. Perfect love casts out fear (I John 4:18).

Some have argued that the United States is somehow the new chosen people of God and therefore subject to blessings from God above other nations. This is wrong on several levels. God chose Israel to be a blessing to all nations, not somehow better than all nations. As Christians, we believe God fulfilled this purpose when Jesus, a Jew, died to redeem all people. When Israel fell short, God judged Israel, and sent prophets to cause Israel to repent. Likewise, we are called by God to be a blessing to all nations. We have been richly blessed and are called to be good stewards of those blessings, not storing those blessings in barns and protecting those blessings from those who are in need. Remember, when we serve the least, we serve Jesus (Matthew 25). Also, remember that Jesus defines our neighbor without regard to national origin (see the story of the Good Samaritan, Luke 10:25-37).

We are also called by God not to have loyalties that get in the way of our worship of God and our reliance on God. In a word, this is the command to avoid idolatry. It is easy to cross the line when we start putting symbols in our sanctuary that represent loyalty to anything but God. This can go to extremes in movements such as iconoclasm,

Pennsylvania Church Offers Community a 'Fresh Start'

The local laundromat was Linda's chapel. It was where she first shared a prayer concern that had been weighing heavily on her mind — and on her family's heart — to say nothing of their budget.

At the time, Linda was dealing with stage 4 cancer.

She confessed to the pastor and volunteers from the Presbyterian Church of Waynesboro, Pennsylvania, who were gathered around Linda and her daughter, "Since I got sick, my washer and dryer can't handle the volume of blankets and bedding."

The cost of doing laundry was driving Linda's family and other families deeper into poverty. And so began the church's "Fresh Start: Loads of Love" laundry outreach program, funded in part by a grant received from the Presbytery of Carlisle's portion of the Peace & Global Witness Offering. The presbytery grants empower congregations and individuals to become peacemakers in their communities and in the world.

Traditionally received on World Communion Sunday, the Peace & Global Witness Offering is unique in that half of it is directed to peacemaking and global witness efforts at the national church level to address critical justice issues around the world. Twenty-five percent is retained by our congregation for peace and reconciliation work, and 25% is kept by mid councils for similar ministries on the regional level.

"The Waynesboro church's laundry outreach program exemplifies the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s longstanding commitment to peacemaking," said the Rev. Wilson Kennedy, the PC(USA)'s associate director for Special Offerings and Appeals. "Even the simplest tasks, like washing clothes for those on the margins of our communities, helps sow seeds of peace like Jesus commands us."

And following Jesus' commandments is integral to the mission of "Fresh Start."

The Rev. Caroline Vickery says, "We know that Jesus makes it clear that how we treat the vulnerable is how we treat Jesus. Most of our members are college-educated, literate and middle-class. Our laundry outreach has put them in touch with a world whose hardships they're unaware of. It comes as a shock for people to realize how costly doing your laundry can be and to
