To the Saints at First Presbyterian:

Greetings. As I write this message, it is Maundy Thursday, a significant day in Holy Week. To get to the resurrection, one must go through several agonizing events. Maundy Thursday is one of them followed by Good Friday and finally Easter and the empty tomb where Jesus was buried for three days before resurrection.

Easter is the foundation of the Christian faith. Resurrection is what significantly makes us Christian. If every doctrine of our faith was removed, resurrection would have to remain if we are to be who we say we are. Resurrection is what we are about. It is why we worship on Sundays. Sabbath is Friday and three days later is Sunday, resurrection day.

Ann Weems has written a book entitled, <u>Kneeling in Jerusalem.</u> She has a poem about Holy week and Easter. I'd like to share some of it with you.

She writes: "Holy is the week...Holy, consecrated, belonging to God... We move from hosannas to horror with the predictable ease of those who know not what they do.

Our hosannas sung; our palms waved, let us go with passion into this week. It is time to curse the fig trees that do not yield fruit. It is time to cleanse our temples of blasphemy... It is time for preparation. The time to give thanks and break bread is upon us. The time to give thanks and drink of the cup is imminent. Eat, drink, remember. On this night of nights, each one must ask, as we dip our bread in the wine, "Is It I?" And on that darkest of days, each of us must stand beneath the tree and watch the dying if we are to be there when the stone is rolled away.

The only road to Easter morning is through the unrelenting shadows of that Friday. Only then will the alleluias be sung: only then will the dancing begin."

I can't really imagine what it would be like to be crucified. It is truly a terribly horrible death. Jesus wasn't given the dignity of a Roman death. Only the lowest of society suffered the cross.

Jesus paid the full price of our salvation. We can live because Jesus died, took our place. Our relationship with God was sealed. While this Easter, we come to church as we have for many years, Easter never loses it's meaning.

I hope this Easter will be a time of renewal and recommitment to our resurrected Lord. From death came life. It's out pilgrimage too.






