To the Saints at First Presbyterian:

Greetings. We are moving into the Season of Lent. Lent is the Latin word for "lengthening." The days are getting longer. We always participate in this season for it is a very important season. It is about Jesus' passion for us. It is about his life, suffering, death and resurrection. We will celebrate these events with different worship services as we always do but this year some will be somewhat different.

Beginning with Ash Wednesday, on Feb 18, we will have an Ash Wednesday service the first Sunday of Lent. There will be no Ash Wednesday service on Ash Wednesday Feb. 14. We changed this because so many of you want to attend but just don't get out at night. So, the first Sunday will be an Ash Wednesday service for everyone.

We will again have soup and devotionals on Wednesday night at 6:00 o'clock. The devotionals will be held in the fellowship hall after supper. We won't go into the sanctuary. That saves us from having to turn on lights and either air or heat. We will invite Grace Episcopal and First Christian to join us. We will look at some of the characters who were part of the passion story.

Palm Sunday will be the choir cantata in place of the sermon. We will have palm branches for everyone as always.

On Maundy Thursday in Holy Week, we will meet in the fellowship hall as we have done before and invite you to bring either bread, fruit, and/or cheese and wine if you prefer. The service will include the upper room last supper as we eat together and a Good Friday type Tenebrae. We will slowly extinguish the candles and end in darkness.

For Easter, we will have again the blooming cross and invite all to bring flowers to place upon the cross. We will convert the Chrismon tree to a Lenten cross for the sanctuary during the Lenten season. The Chrismon tree was the Christmas tree in the sanctuary.

This is a holy season remembering the love God has for us, to be one of us, live as we live, feel what we feel and experience life as we experience it. His death was in our place for we were the ones who should be on the cross for our sinfulness and rejection of God.

I hope you can make the services this Lenten season and I hope they will be meaningful for you.



Food insecurity is a frightening fact of life for many in our community. On any given day, 66,000 people in southeast Texas experience the pain of hunger: 5,000 of which are children. Making the community food bank essential for so many in our community.

What are common characteristics of food insecurity?

- Limiting the amount of money spent on food buying less
- Eating less food because of low money
- Inability to participate in a Food Assistance Program
- Using coping mechanisms when food is scarce: e.g., buying cheaper, lower nutritional quality food
- Two-thirds of food insecure households have an adult with a full-time job

This year the youth will be participating in the SouperBowl of Caring!

On Sunday, February 11th before worship in front of the Sanctuary the youth will be collecting canned goods for the SouperBowl of Caring. The canned goods will be donated to our local Alvin/Manvel Community Food Pantry. If you would like to make a monetary donation please note Souper Bowl on your check or envelope and place it in the offering during worship.

Here's a friendly reminder that on the 1st Sunday of each month, we are collecting non-perishable food items for the Alvin/Manvel Community Food Pantry. The holidays may be over, but for the folks who can't afford to buy food, the need is still there.
