To the Saints at First Presbyterian:

Greetings.

We have finished our first year together and some really good things have happened. We are moving towards the search process that takes a pretty good amount of time. I would like to say a few things about the process so far.

One, I was to be here as the “new kid on the block.” There had to be a transition period from Craig to someone else. Craig was no longer here. Knowing how popular he was and is, and all the really great things he accomplished with your help, following him would not be an easy job. The new person would obviously be different. Some would like the difference and some maybe not, but the transition had to be made. I would receive the good, the bad and the ugly so to speak. Turning loose is never really easy but it is necessary to prepare for the next pastor you will call.

Two, I created a different office setting. It looks quite different from before, another transition change that is visual.

Three, I made some very different changes in worship. Added more liturgy and a lot more music. Added the guitar and different hymns from different sources. Worship took on a different setting and experience. The new pastor would make changes as he or she felt necessary, so adjusting to my style was something that would also come with a new person who would change what I implemented.

Four, we made some major adjustments in our financial situation. Mandi has helped us see that the Payte fund was losing \$15K each year from interest against the loan taken out in the church’s past. The loan wasn’t being paid back and the interest was draining the account. Eventually the fund would be totally gone. We moved it to Edward Jones and a totally different type account, paid off the loan with some of the money in the account and now we are making money, restoring the fund. Last count since December was over \$6K.

Five, I have worked with the Session to strengthen it so they would have a better understanding just what their role is in church government. We had a really good officer training session for the new elders and anyone else who wanted to come to the class.

Six, I have made it my position that all matters of the church will be visible to all members. Everyone needs to know what transpires when decisions are made unless of course it’s personal or confidential. I believe in our system of government and I follow the Book of Order. I suspect this attitude comes from the fact that I came from another denomination with a totally different system of government. I really like our way of doing things. It’s good to be back in the Presbyterian system.

Seven, I have given the worship committee and Session a comprehensive worship questionnaire. It’s quite detailed and after I get their response, I plan to give it to you to fill out and return. This will give us the thoughts you have about worship and something the new person will be interested in knowing. You will also want to know the results. I wanted to do this to not only get information but to introduce you to the detailed process you will need to go through to complete the Church Information Form that ministers will read as they are looking for a church to serve. Some of you have done this before.

Finally, I am looking forward to a Communicants Class next month. Several young people have shown interest in looking into church membership. Class is open to anyone who would like to learn more about our faith and church.

I hope if any of you have questions or thoughts about anything that I have said, you will drop by the office for a visit. My door is always open.

I have truly enjoyed being part of your life here at First Presbyterian and look forward to another great year as we move into the future where Christ awaits.

Daylight Savings Time begins Sunday, March 8, 2020.

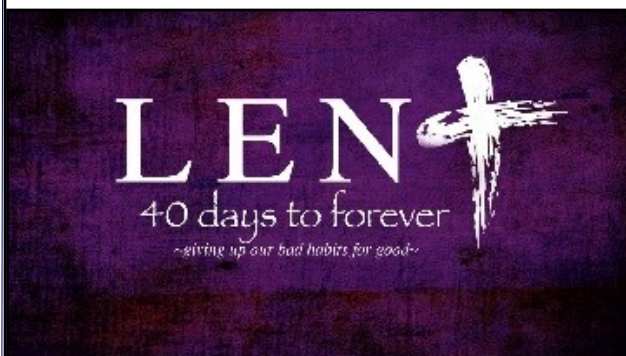

Lent

On Ash Wednesday, February 26, 2020, we were marked in church with an ashen cross on our forehead. When this was imprinted, we were reminded that “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return” (Ecclesiastes 3:20). In addition to imprinting foreheads within church walls, each year clergy from many churches throughout the world, including Grace Episcopal Church in Alvin, took to the streets during the lunch hour, looked complete strangers in the eye, smudged some ashes on their forehead, and told them that they will die!

In an article in this February edition of the “The Bulletin,” the Reverend Becky Zartman, the Canon for Welcome and Evangelism at Christ Church Episcopal Cathedral in downtown Houston, reminded her readers that “Yes, we will die. Yes, we screw up. And yes, God still loves us beyond all rhyme or reason, we frail mortals that we are. Declaring our frailty, declaring our dependence on God, declaring that our time is short all sets us free to recognize that we are always held in God’s loving embrace, every day of our lives, no matter how we’ve failed, no matter how much or little time we’ve been given.”

On Wednesday, February 12, 2020, the Reverend Lindsay Harren-Lewis, Associate Pastor at Fairmount Presbyterian Church in Cleveland Heights, Ohio, preached during opening worship of the Presbyterian Mission Agency Board on the text of Micah 6:6-8, (“what God requires”). Pastor Lindsay reminded those gathered that “it’s not their

worship practices God cares about, but their relationships with others. And since God cares about those in the margin, we are to walk with God in a way that brings justice, humility and love for all others.”

At this same Presbyterian Mission Board meeting, the Reverend Dr. Kathryn Threadgill, Associate for Vital Congregation for the Presbyterian Church (USA), spoke on Matthew 25:31–46 (the parable of the sheep and the goats). She likened it to the seven marks, defining what a vital congregation is and isn’t.

Lifelong discipleship formation vs. complacent “Christian” piety, simply teaching good morals or offering the latest programs.

Intentional, authentic evangelism vs. “Jesus freaks;” “Christian” hypocrisy; a committee.

Outward incarnational focus vs. inward institutional survival; closed communities of assimilation/exclusion.

Empower servant leadership vs. the pastor’s job; monopolized leadership; hiring the young,

The meeting was opened in prayer by C.O. After a Devotion from Janet DeLeon, C.O. shared with the Session the creation of a questionnaire that will give the congregation an idea of what they like and don't like concerning their church, worship, and Minister. “We believe that if we show these marks — like Thomas needed to see the marks of Jesus and feel them in order to believe that was the risen Christ — we believe that if people can see and feel these marks within their congregations then they will come to know and believe their Lord and Savior is in Jesus Christ,” Threadgill said. “That’s what we’re after in congregational vitality.”
