Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Recently I was invited to be a part of a 13th birthday celebration for one of my students. His parents asked me to bring a piece of paper to the event with three things on it: 1) Good qualities that I see in their son; 2) A piece of advice for their son; and 3) A prayer for their son as he enters his teen years.

As I was considering what advice I would give to a thirteen-year-old a couple of verses of scripture came to my mind. The verses were verses that I had memorized years ago but had not given much thought to recently. The verses are Proverbs 3:5-6. "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make straight your paths." These are great verses for all of us to live our lives by, not just a thirteen year old boy with his entire life in front of him.

These two verses can be divided into four parts. The first three parts contain things the writer is encouraging his readers to do. The fourth part contains a promise for those who do them.

The first thing we are encouraged to do is "Trust in the LORD with all your heart." With the conviction that God is going to fulfill His purpose for us, we should trust the LORD for everything. We should trust that God is going to lead us, provide for us, and always do what is best for us. In life there are things that happen that we do not always understand. We sometime ask, "why did this happen to me or to someone I love?" In times like these it can be difficult to trust the LORD with

all our hearts. We regularly have to remind ourselves "that for those who love God all things work together for good." (Romans 8:28)

The second thing we are encouraged to do is, "not lean on your own understanding." Part of what this involves is not relying on our own gifts and abilities, but putting our reliance on the One who gave us the gifts and abilities we possess. Duane A. Garrett commenting on this phrase says that it, "further explains what it means to trust in the Lord. The wise will govern themselves by what the Lord Himself declares. They do not trust their own finite and often-mistaken understanding if it opposes God's word."

The third thing we are encourage to do is, "in all your ways acknowledge Him." We have nothing good that we have not received from God. Because of this we should always give the credit and the glory to Him.

If we will do these three things we are promised that "He will make straight your paths." To make one's paths straight means to continually progress toward a goal. It also means not to stray from the path that God has set before us. The odds are that a thirteen-year-old still has a long path left to follow in this life. For those of us who are older, the path we have to journey on keeps getting shorter. But even for us it is comforting to know that God will make our paths straight.

Let us follow the advice of Proverbs 3 and trust the LORD with all of our hearts.

Meet Our St. Stephen's Family SARAH HUDSON

Sarah was born and grew up here in OKC. She is the daughter of Mary Frances Derrick (our own "Miss Butch"), a teacher and Wilbur Derrick, property manager, pilot, and former OU football player. Her parents divorced after 31 years when Sarah was still in her 20's. She had a brother named John who battled with depression, and took his own life in 2002 at the young age of 37 years. This was a devastating loss for Sarah. She believes that his death brought her closer to her Lord.

In 1995 Sarah married Jeff Hudson. They were together for six years and married for five years, divorcing in 2000. Sarah and Jeff have two daughters: Hannah, born in 1998. She is currently a 3rd grade teacher and in 2023 married Jay Tedesco, a police officer. Hope, was born 18 months after her sister in 1999. She is a counselor (soon to be licensed) who works at the Yukon Counseling Center. Sarah lives with mom "Miss Butch" and two large dogs named Ella and JoJo.

Sarah spoke of happy memories of times spent with maternal grandparents in their cabin home in Hammond, Louisianna and paternal grandparents in Woodward, OK. She feels blessed to have had such outstanding role models who stressed the importance of dedication to education and hard work.

Sarah graduated from Putnam City North high school in 1987, and went on to receive a degree from the University of Central Oklahoma in Early Childhood Education. She briefly tried accounting and discovered it was not for her. From 1994-1998 Sarah taught first grade at Wiley Post Elementary. She took time off when her daughters were born. In 2000 she returned to teaching kindergarten at Westminster Montessori School. She instructs her students in language and practical life skills, encouraging independence and seeking help from peers. She believes learning is a team effort and expects parents to work with her. Now in her 29th year of teaching, Sarah has always loved children and childcare. She says it is a privilege to be with children. "God's plan for my life — I love teaching!"

Sarah's favorite quote: "The soul is healed by being with children." Fyodor Dostoevsky

Sarah loves reading in her spare time. She enjoys C. S. Lewis, Chronicles of Narnia, her favorite titled "Screwtape Letter". Another favorite is "The Shack" by William P. Young. She likes time outdoors just being in God's creation. She even enjoys pulling weeds in the yard. Sarah streams favorite shows like *Breaking Bad, Walking Dead* and *60 Days In*. Sarah loves all kinds of cuisine but won't eat seafood. Sarah's life heros are her parents, who loved the Lord and worked hard.

As a girl Sarah was a huge Wonder Woman fan and still is. She was born amazingly flexible and well-coordinated. She was a cheerleader and a gymnast. Even today she can walk on her hands, do cartwheels and jump rope.

Sarah's favorite parable is the "Parable of the Workers" from Matthew 20:1-16. She says, "The opportunity to meet Jesus is never lost." We have "every last chance". She prefers the King James version of the Bible. Her favorite Bible verses are: Romans 10:9

That if thou shalt confess with the mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. Luke 10:19, 20

19 Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you.

Sarah's family were charter members of St. Stephen's. She grew up in the church that she loves. She sees our congregation as "immensely accepting and diverse". She knows many in our church as very generous people who have helped her in the past. Sarah served as Deacon one term, but her biggest contributions have been to the children of St. Stephen's, working with vacation Bible school, teaching preschool, Sunday school, and providing infant care during worship. Some of her favorites included the Von Tungeln's, the McBride kids, and the Daub's grandkids.

A gifted teacher, Sarah, has given years to the young children of our community and our church. Her dedication to her calling and to a God-driven life is impressive. She says, "I try to stay with God every day. My heart is filled with gratitude". I ask God: "Help me to be able to take care of what I have and to be content with what I have".

As part of our St. Stephen's family, Sarah exudes joy! She is a welcome "ray of sunshine" and a warm hand of friendship and love, always reaching out to all in our congregation.

To quote Mother Teresa:

"Joy is the token of a generous personality, a mantle that clothes a life of self-giving. A person who has this gift is like a sun in the community."
