Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Neutrality." I have been reading a book by Gordon H. Clark entitled A Christian Philosophy of Education. In this book there is a chapter entitled "Neutrality," in which Clark discusses whether neutrality is possible in education. In it he sees two types of education, theistic education, and non-theistic education. Though he is a big proponent of theistic, Christian education, he does not discount the need for non-theistic or secular education. Though he does argue that neutrality is not possible in education. What this chapter got me thinking about is the whole idea of neutrality.

All of us tend to have biases and preferences on a wide range of topics. We tend to lean one way or the other on many things. In my life, I have sought not to become overly dogmatic on many things, though there are a number of things that I hold a strong opinion on. There are a few things in life that we might truly be neutral about. For instance, I am a little bit of a sports fan. In many sporting events I do care about who wins. On the other hand, there are a lot of games played where I am neutral, I could care less about who wins. Many other examples could be given from life where we might be able to say, "I truly do not have a preference."

There is one critical area though where neutrality is not possible. In Matthew 16 Jesus asks His disciples the question, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" He then asks His disciples, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter gives the classic answer, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." In Luke 11:23 Jesus says, "Whoever is not

with me is against me." When it comes to Jesus neutrality is not possible. There are people who want to be or think they are neutral when it comes to Jesus. There are those who will say that Jesus was a good man, a good teacher, a prophet. Some will go as far as to say that Jesus was the second greatest prophet who ever lived as is true in the Muslim faith. But this will not do! If we are not with Jesus, we are against Him. Our confession must be that of Peter, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

It is a matter of either/or. It cannot be both. John in 1 John makes it clear that a person is either walking in the light or walking in darkness. In Ephesians 2 Paul makes it plain that we are either dead in our sins or we are alive in Christ. Jesus tells the people in John 8:24, "unless you believe that I am he you will die in your sins." Neutrality is not possible when it comes to Jesus.

By God's grace, God makes us alive in Christ. Through the Holy Spirit we can say, "Jesus is Lord." And it is the Holy Spirit that bears witness with our spirits that we are now children of God. This is where it begins. But our walk with Jesus must progress beyond our confession. After Peter's confession Jesus tells His disciples "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). As we mature in the faith our lives must be marked less by "my will," and more by "Thy will."

This is a lifelong process. We are still aware that too much of our lives are about "me," and not enough of our lives are about "Him." Back to the main point. There can be no neutrality when it comes to Jesus.
