1 SIZE IT RIGHT

THICKNESS

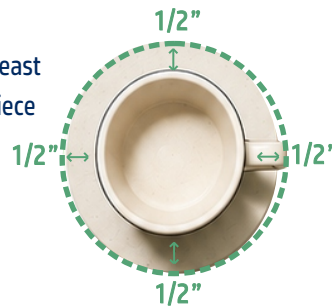


- ✓ Thick enough to stay flat
- ✓ Thin enough to dry

DIAMETER

Extend cookie to at least
1/2" beyond your piece

Not too big to hog
kiln shelf space



A COOKIE CAN'T CATCH GLAZE THAT LANDS OUTSIDE IT'S EDGE!

2 BUILD IT RIGHT

Compress the clay well

Smooth both sides

Round the edges slightly

Weight it to keep flat



BISQUE FIRE BEFORE USE

3 APPLY KILN WASH

This is optional

Acts as a buffer so if
your glaze runs, it
sticks to the wash
instead of your cookie.



Brush on 2-3 thin coats on ONE side

Allow each coat to dry before applying the next

Reapply when it begins to wear away



4 AFTER FIRING

- ✓ Remove any glaze drips with
a metal paint scraper or
grinding stone.

- ✓ A clean cookie is ready for
the next firing.

5 STORAGE

- ✓ Stack carefully
- ✓ Store flat
- ✓ Store your cookies at home.
We don't have space in the
studio.



WRITE YOUR INITIALS ON THE BACK WITH A CHINA MARKER

6 TOSS YOUR COOKIES if

- ✓ It is cracked
- ✓ It is warped
- ✓ It has glaze on it



A WELL MAINTAINED COOKIE WILL LAST SEVERAL FIRINGS

ONE MORE THING

Always inspect your cookie before reusing. Even a thin hidden glaze bead from the last firing can fuse to your next piece. A quick inspection can save your entire project.
