- You are at a Contest to support and cheer for your team and to enjoy the skill and competition; not to intimidate or ridicule the other team and its fans.
- Athletics are a learning experience for children and that mistakes are sometimes made. Praise them in their attempt to improve themselves as students, as athletes, and as people.
- A ticket is a privilege to observe the Contest, not a license to verbally assault others and be generally obnoxious.
- Show respect for the opposing players, coaches, spectators, and OFFICIALS. Treat them as you would treat a guest in your own home.
- Respect the integrity and judgment of Contest officials. Understand that they are doing their best to help promote the athlete, and admire their willingness to participate in full view of the public.
- Refrain from the use of any controlled substances (alcohol, drugs, tobacco, etc.) before, and during Contests, and afterwards on or near the site of the Contest (i.e. tailgating).
- Be a positive role model through your own actions and by censuring those around you whose behavior is unbecoming.

The Board recognizes that the safe participation of athletes in extracurricular activities and the conducting of events in as safe a manner as possible for students, coaches / sponsors, staff and spectators alike requires the cooperation of all individuals involved in the program including the parents / guardians and friends of the player. It shall be the policy of the Board, therefore, to exclude from any such program or any player, coach / sponsor, staff member, parent / guardian, or spectator who behaves or acts in any manner so as to cause, or whose participation directly or indirectly causes the disruption of a program or event or places any person participating in or attending any such program or even in a dangerous situation.
